End of day dismissal



An important reminder about moving safely from campus at the end of the day.

Your subject teacher will dismiss you when the end of day bell rings at 3pm. In the lead up to the dismissal they will end their lesson by summarising the key knowledge and skills you acquired, ask you to clear up equipment, ensure your desk/area is spotless and inform you to stand behind your chair. They will then nominate a Teacher Star of the Lesson and a Student Star of the Lesson. This will be added to Class Charts so your parents/carers can celebrate with you when you get home.

You will be dismissed and should follow the campus exit maps to leave the building. Be vigilant when crossing at the Pedestrian Crossing (where Ms Clarke stands) and only cross when it indicates you can. Ensure you are also crossing Little Kingsway (the road next to the subway ramp) carefully, stopping when drivers exit/enter the road.

Finally, your conduct whilst waiting for the 758 and 810 school bus should be impeccable. Remember safety first and you represent our school.



VE DAY - 80th Anniversary



On 8 May 1945, people in Britain and across the world celebrated Victory in Europe, now known as VE Day. This marked the unconditional surrender of Germany and meant an end to nearly six years of a war. Some people celebrated early. Many people in Britain didn't wait for the official day of celebration and began the festivities as soon as they heard the news on 7 May. After years of wartime restrictions and dangers – from food and clothes rationing to blackouts and bombing raids – many were finally able to let loose and enjoy themselves.

At The Kingsway School, we have provided students with the opportunity to engage with an immersive experience that brings key moments from VE Day to life for its 80th Anniversary.
