Opportunity: You will continue with working towards your 'Kingsway Cultural Diploma' and you will get a chance to share what you have done on our review day on 7th July.


Achievement: As well as Year 9 exams, you will all be completing formal assessments that will feed into you 'end of year reports'.



Love To Read - Broadway






- Our 'GROWTH' library theme continues in Summer we're celebrating all types of growth, including developing a 'growth mindset'
