





How do we calculate the **circumference** and **area** of a circle?



What is the **arc** of a circle and how do we calculate its length?



What is the **sector** of a circle and how do we calculate its area?.



 $Circumference = \pi x diameter$ 

$$Area = \pi x radius^2$$

An **arc** is part of the circumference of a circle.

$$Arc\ length = \frac{\theta}{360} \ x \ circumference$$

A **sector** is a portion of the circle, enclosed by 2 radii and an arc between them.

Sector area = 
$$\frac{\theta}{360}$$
 x area of circle




# What's in your BLACKPOOL backpack?












#### **Achievement**






#### You as role model - Set the standard this week


