Morning Line up happens daily at **8.30am**. This is our welcome to school routine.


The green gates open from **8.00am** and are staffed by your year team so if you arrive early, please come onto campus and chat with friends.



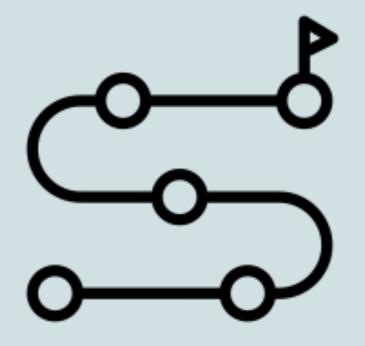
