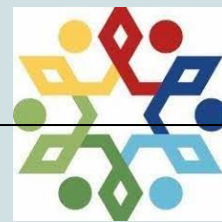

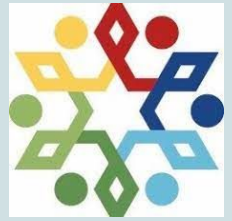

What small changes could you make to show more compassion and respect towards each other and our school community? When small acts of kindness are combined, the impact is huge.

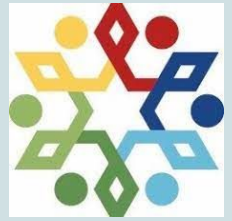
This week our Year 11 students will be sitting their second round of practice exams. Their hard work and preparation are giving them the confidence to perform to the highest standards. We wish them luck.

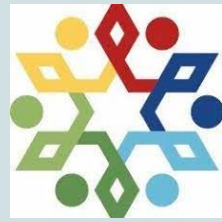

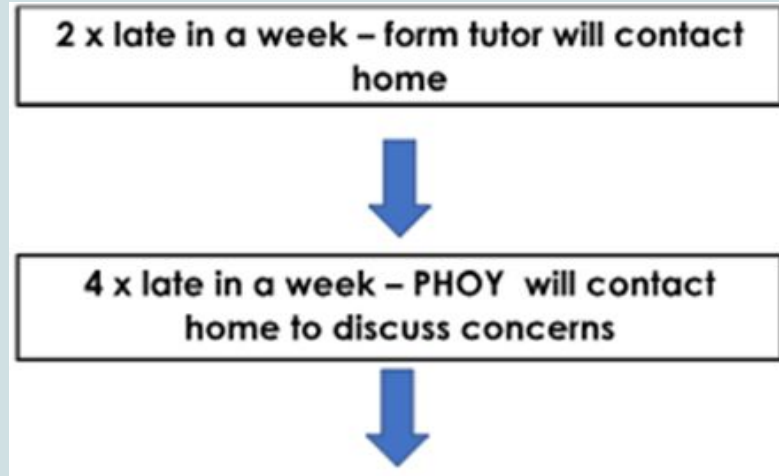


Ready-Respect-Safe Punctuality Matters

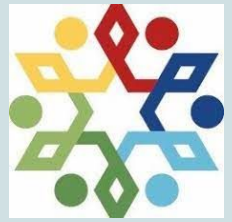

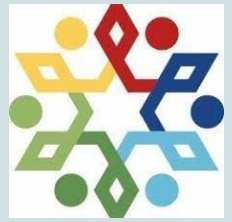

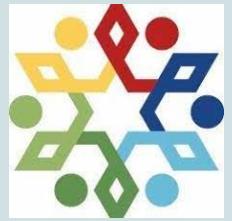

Every student who has 100% attendance for that week is entered into the draw.

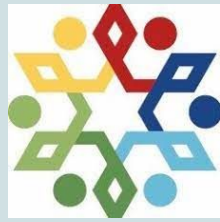

Important Information Regarding Buses



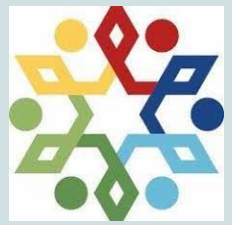
The 758B will not be running 10 minutes earlier as published by the Bee Network over half term. Timings of this bus in the morning will remain unchanged at present.

School have contacted the Bee Network for more information regarding the relocation of bus stops while this work is carried out. We will keep you updated.

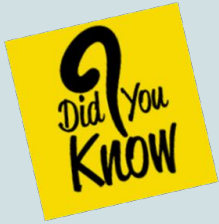

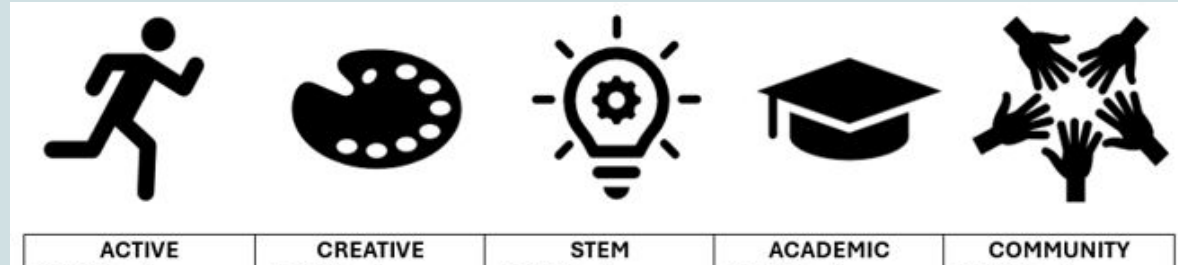

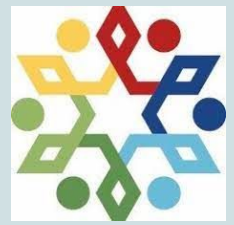

Saturday 1st March - Monday 31st March

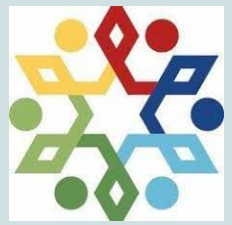
Every March, Women's History Month raises awareness of the contributions women have made to events through history and society.

Film Screening - Friday 7th March

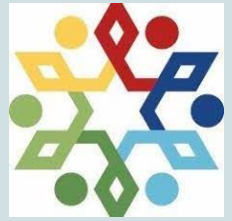
Film: Gravity (2013, PG-13) – Oscar-winning space drama starring Sandra Bullock as an astronaut who must survive against all odds.

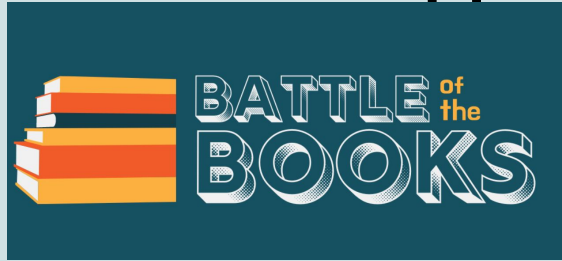

There will also be a form literacy quiz in your literacy sessions this week. The best scores in each form will get prizes so again please take part.

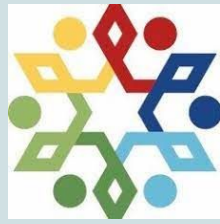

World Book Day - Thursday 6th March



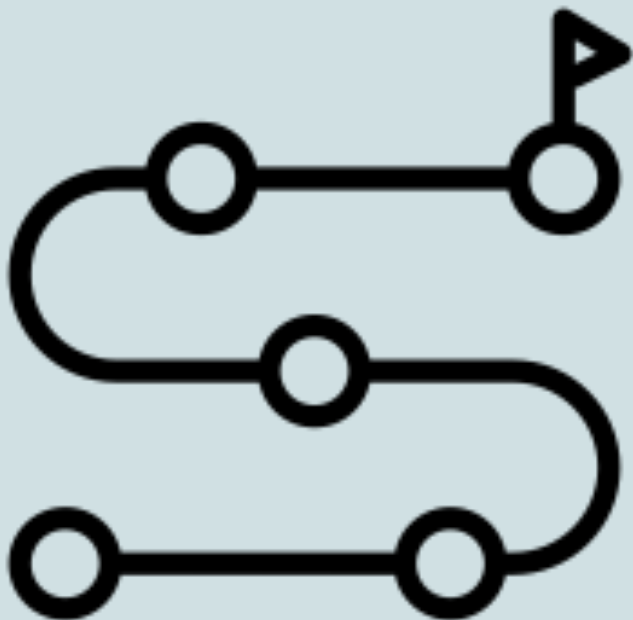
March 6th will be World Book Day and as we did last year , there will be lots of opportunities across the school to share a love of reading.

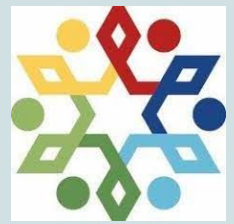

- You will be asked to read the following statement, agree to the terms of it and sign to acknowledge this.

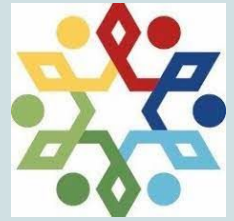

In practice, this could look like:

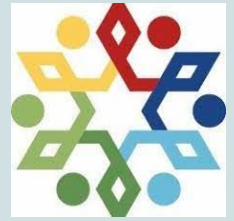
- ❑ Valuing other students ideas, values, work and contributions.

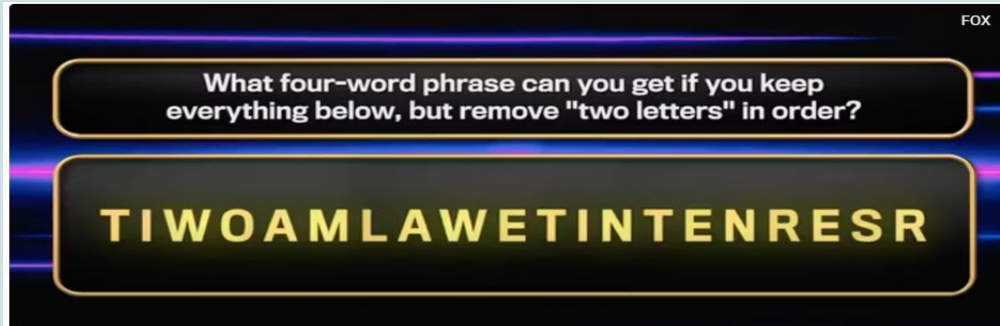

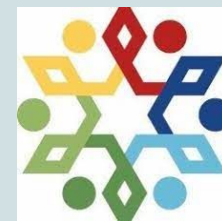
