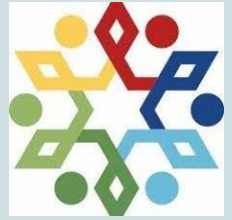

In assembly last week, I spoke to you all about how the foundations of our school's culture are built on our ABCs:

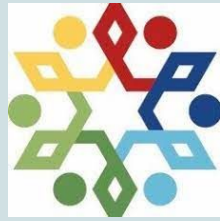

Ready-Respect-Safe

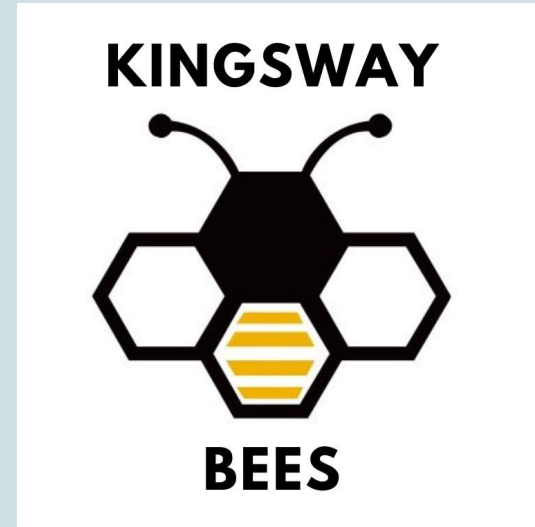


Your teachers will use this phrase regularly in their lessons. You will also be directed to practice this as part of our Assembly routine.

Safe

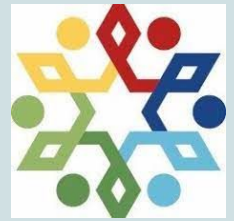


As the days are getting longer, you may be spending longer time out than over winter. Remember these key things to keep you safe:

ABC Recognition

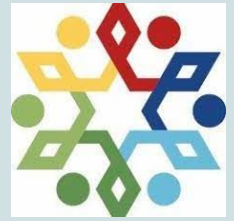


SLT or people on patrol will visit your lessons.

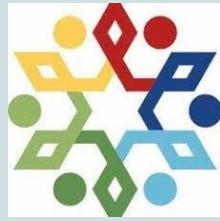

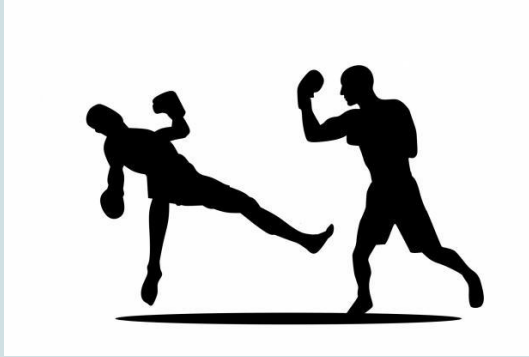


Due to the weather being warmer and dryer, Foxland field will be open B2 **WHEN DRY**. But please note:

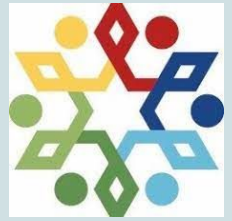


All students who have attendance over 98% from now until the end of term will receive an Easter treat.

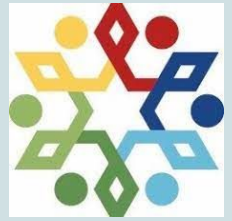

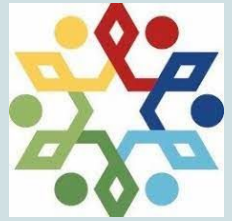
Year 10 Parent Information Evening

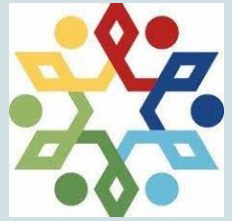

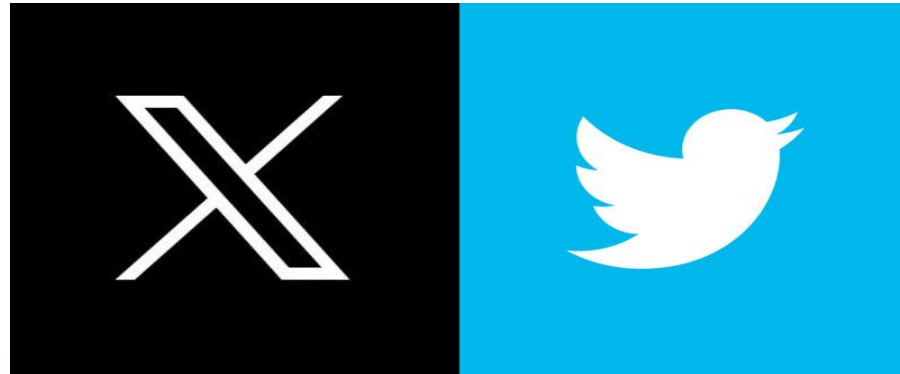




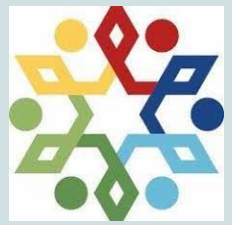

This week's film is 'Queen of Katwe' depicting how a Ugandan girl's life changes forever when she discovers she has an amazing talent for chess.

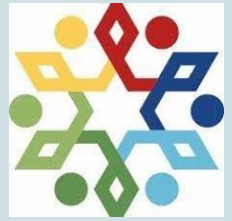
The film will start at 3.15pm this Friday 28th March in B19a. The film will finish by 4.45pm.

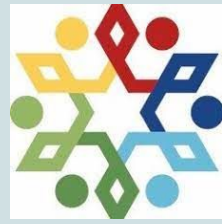

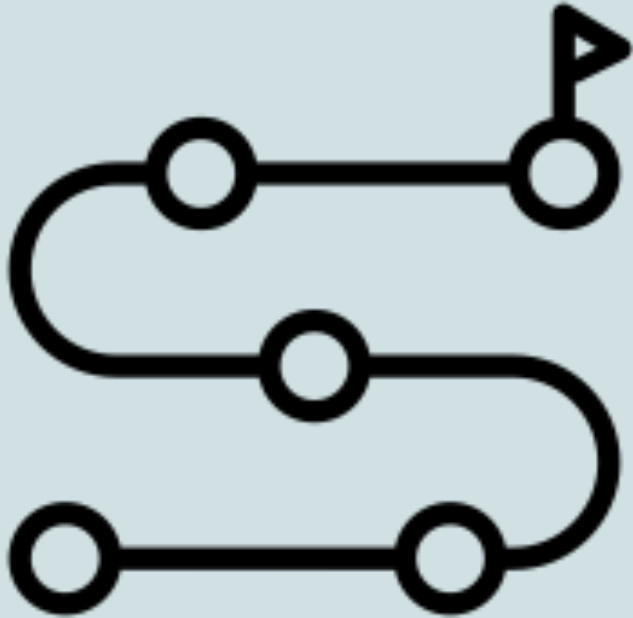
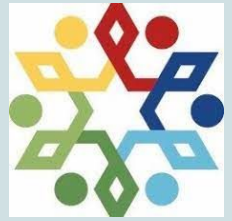

At TKS, you will often hear your teachers talk about your 'learning journey' and the key bits of 'essential knowledge' you will learn as you move through school.

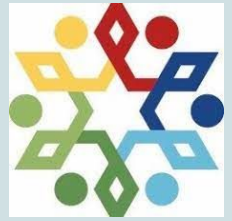

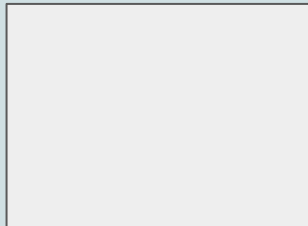
Compassion
