In ionic bonding...

Metals lose electrons to form positive ions and non-metals gain electrons to form negative ions.

In **covalent bonding**... Non-metals bond by sharing a pair of electrons.

Radioactive decay is random. Ionising radiation is emitted from the nucleus of unstable atoms.

There are **three** types of **radioactive decay**: Alpha - helium nuclei

Beta - high speed electron

Gamma - high energy EM wave

Half-life, is the time it take... ...the activity of a radioactive sample to halve or the time it take half of a radioactive sample to decay.

Enzymes are biological catalysts that are used in the digestive system to speed up the rate of reaction without being used up. The **digestive system** breaks up large insoluble molecules into smaller soluble ones...

Proteins \rightarrow amino acids Carbohydrates \rightarrow Simple sugars Fats \rightarrow Fatty acids + glycerol. Photosynthesis requires energy: carbon + water → glucose dioxide + oxygen








Achievement

TKS.






