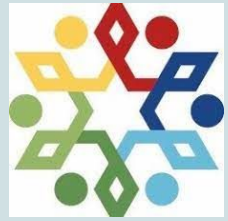


The Kingsway School Broadway Key Messages

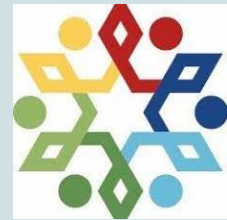
Rewards Day 28th March
