If any fixtures are cancelled because of the weather we will try and let you know in advance.



A TYPICAL FOOD PARCEL INCLUDES:

- Breakfast cereals
- Soup
- Pasta
- Pasta sauce
- Tinned beans
- Tinned meat
- Tinned vegetables
- Potatoes
- Tinned fruit
- Tinned tomatoes
- Tea or coffee

- Milk
- Orange juice
- Tinned fish
- Puddings
- Sugar
- Biscuits
- Snacks and treats
- Toiletry items including soap, shampoo, toothpaste
- Nappies and baby wipes

Year 11 Pre-Public Exams




- Year 11 Pre-Public Exams take place between Monday 4th December and Friday 15th December.

- •Sparx Reader is NOW LIVE for year 10! You have all completed your initial test and a selection of books is waiting for you to try!
- You will have a weekly goal of 300 Sparx Reader Points (SRP) which equates to about 30 minutes of reading. This will be set as homework from January, however you can earn points before then.
- •If you're not enjoying a book you can change it. The more you read the more it will tailor the selection to you.


