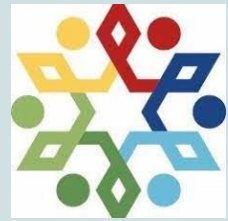


The Kingsway School Foxland Key Messages

I hope that you all enjoyed spending time with your families on Sunday to celebrate Mother's Day. Although originally connected with church, it is more commonly associated with visiting family.

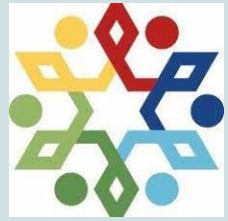

Foxland Big Wins

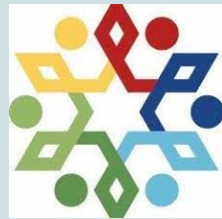


Year 11 have completed their second round of PPEs. Students demonstrated that they have mastered routines to enter and exit the examination halls.

The correct skirts and trousers should be worn as they are meant to be worn and all students should be wearing a blazer throughout the day.

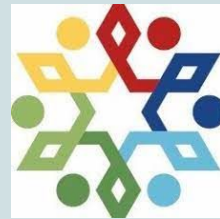
This week we are reminding students about the correct footwear for school. Our School Uniform Policy states that shoes must be:

Broadway: break 2 on Tuesdays - find him at reception.

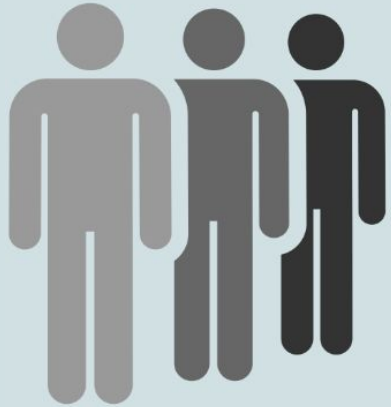
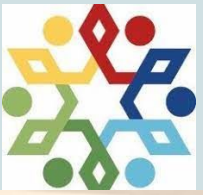

Not productive – students will focus in on just that fact and not the wider context/information

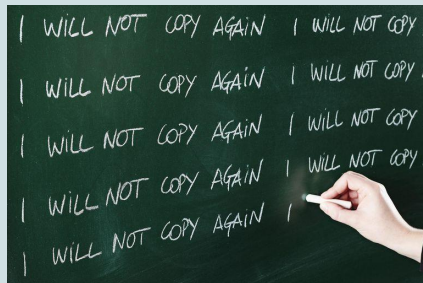

Summarising

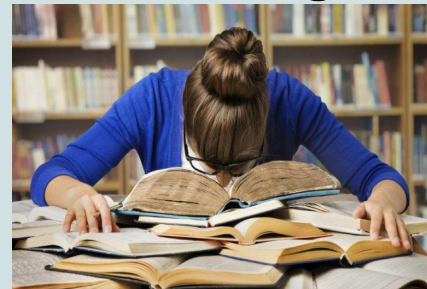

Rewards Day 28th March

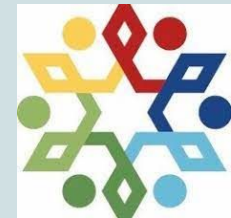
After collecting feedback from student leadership, all year groups consistently put forward that they wanted to watch a film in the Hall for Rewards Day.

There will be 5 prize draws taking place each lesson where 1 lucky student from each year group will be called to collect a prize from the main reception.

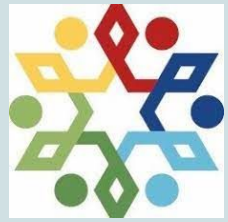
