What is a foodbank and why do people use them?



- A food bank is a non-profit organization that collects and distributes food to people struggling with hunger.
- A simple box of food makes a big difference, with foodbanks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems.

to using foodbanks







What's in a food box?



The foodbank has worked with nutritionists to ensure food parcels contain sufficient nutrition for at least three days worth of healthy, balanced meals for individuals and families.

A TYPICAL FOOD PARCEL INCLUDES:

- Breakfast cereals
- Soup
- Pasta
- Pasta sauce
- Tinned beans
- Tinned meat
- Tinned vegetables
- Potatoes
- Tinned fruit
- Tinned tomatoes
- Tea or coffee

- Milk
- Orange juice
- Tinned fish
- Puddings
- Sugar
- Biscuits
- Snacks and treats
- Toiletry items including soap, shampoo, toothpaste
- Nappies and baby wipes





How can you donate?



- 1) Choose an item from the list to bring in
- 2) From Friday 1st December until Friday 15th December please bring you item in
- 3) Deposit your donation in the relevant year group container on your way in to school
 - Broadway Student Services
 - O Foxland Dining Hall
- 4) All donations must be given by Friday 15th December. You can donate more than one item
- 5) Year groups will be rewarded with a non-uniform day if they fill 2 crates

FULL uniform is required in addition to any Christmas Jumper.






Key Messages: Achievement
