
These boxes will be distributed to organisations which help supported young people and care leavers.

- We will be giving our donation to Stockport Foodbank, Trinity Church and Gatley Foodbank at The Bethany Church for distribution to our local community.






What is a foodbank and why do people use them?

- A food bank is a non-profit organization that collects and distributes food to people struggling with hunger.
- A simple box of food makes a big difference, with foodbanks helping prevent crime, housing loss, family breakdown and mental health problems.
- Given the year that we've had, more households are having to resort to using foodbanks





What's in a food box?

The foodbank has worked with nutritionists to ensure food parcels contain sufficient nutrition for at least three days worth of healthy, balanced meals for individuals and families.

A TYPICAL FOOD PARCEL INCLUDES:

- Breakfast cereals
- Soup
- Pasta
- Pasta sauce
- Tinned beans
- Tinned meat
- Tinned vegetables
- Potatoes
- Tinned fruit
- Tinned tomatoes
- Tea or coffee

- Milk
- Orange juice
- Tinned fish
- Puddings
- Sugar
- Biscuits
- Snacks and treats
- Toiletry items including soap, shampoo, toothpaste
- Nappies and baby wipes



How can you donate?

- 3) Deposit your donation in the relevant year group container on your way in to school


Key Messages: Achievement



Beautiful Books:

Your books are the home of knowledge that is essential for your learning. Presenting this well and having pride in your work also will help you revise key knowledge effectively at a later date. 202 of you last week were rewarded a point for a 'Beautiful Book'. Remember:

- Complete all work in black or blue Pen
- Any mistakes are crossed out neatly
- Drawings are done in pencil
- Work is lined off with a ruler at the end of a lesson





Year 11 Pre-Public Exams



- Year 11 Pre-Public Exams take place between Monday 4th December and Friday 15th December.
- Most exams take place in the Foxland Sports Hall although some exams take place in alternative locations - for example the Library.
- Morning exams start at 9.00am (or 8.45am for students in the Library).
- All afternoon exams start at 1.00pm.
- Students will be dismissed to leave school after finishing afternoon exams - this might be before 3.00pm.


