



Key messages: Ready




Punctuality means being organised, taking responsibility, having a positive attitude and much more. Punctuality is, in essence, the soul of politeness. This is why being on time is so important.

Why you should be on time:

- 1. You'll respect your learning time:** Being on time will allow you to maximise your learning opportunities and make every single minute (or second) count.
- 2. You'll respect others people's learning time:** When you arrive late to a lesson you automatically send the message "I don't care about you" to the persons that were waiting for you, their time is just as important as yours.
- 3. You'll show you are reliable and trustworthy:** Being on time shows that you are organised and helps to establish your reputation as a reliable person.

False eyelashes, acrylic nails and earrings are not part of our school uniform and are not permitted be worn to school.

Every morning at Meet and Greet every student is given the opportunity to correct their uniform and show that they are arriving to school ready to learn.




Use of the Canteen

- If seen, these items will be confiscated until the end of the day.






Key messages: Safe





Remember:

- You are never invisible.




Key Messages: Safe



A reminder to all students that vaping is not permitted in our school and vapes are a prohibited item at Kingsway. Vaping is restricted by law to individuals who are over the age of 18. This is due to the health risks associated with inhaling the substances in them.

Key Messages: Respect




Our expectation on Foxland is that students do not wear coats in the building. This is because we want students to show their Kingsway badge with pride and so that we can identify you as part of our school community.

Key Messages: Respect



We should always show respect when communicating with others.

Respectful language and communication refers to the verbal, non-verbal and written communication we use to ensure everyone is included and respected. This includes how we speak, how we write and how we interact with others.

What does respecting others sound like?

- Kind and considerate communication
- Being kind to others by not teasing, taunting, making fun of, threatening or gossiping
- Listening when someone else is talking and not interrupting
- Using good language and polite manners



In our school, we strive to speak to each other with kindness and respect. We choose our words carefully.

We do not tolerate:

- Unkind language
- Swearing and bad language
- Discriminatory language
- Rudeness to others (including staff and students)


