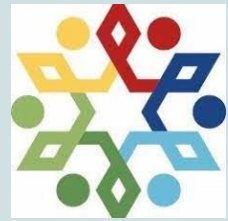


The Kingsway School Foxland Key Messages

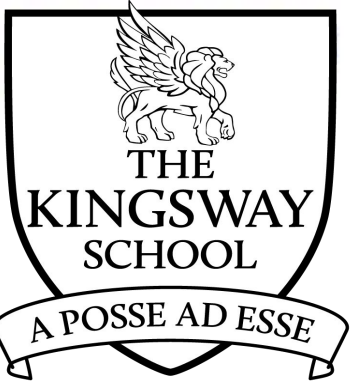

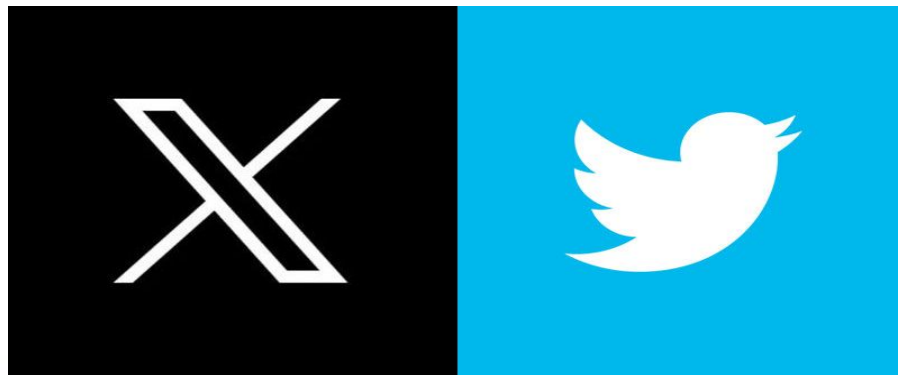

Key messages: Ready



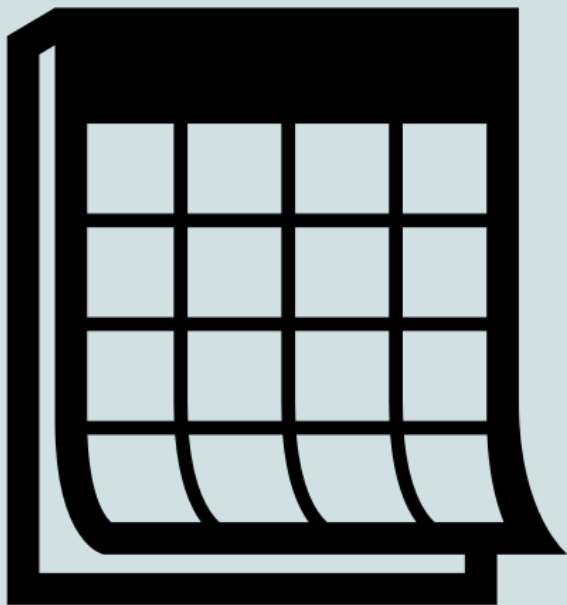
Planners and Timetables:

This will take place during periods 2, 3 and 4 in Foxland Hall and canteen.

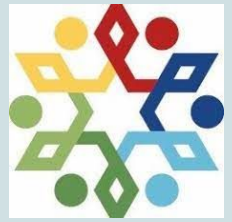
Students will collect their results in tutor groups at the following times:

In order for you to reach your potential and achieve the best possible grades in your GCSE exams it is important that you arrive to your lessons on time.

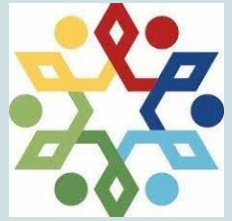

Key Messages: Respect

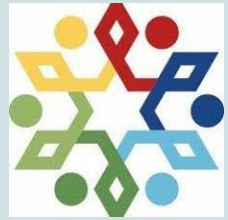


Our expectation on Foxland is that students do not wear coats in the building. This is because we want students to show their Kingsway badge with pride and so that we can identify you as part of our school community.

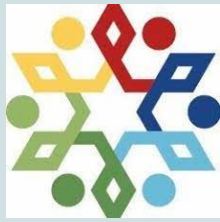
How to level up

Essential Knowledge from Assembly

DIVERSITY (noun)

Diversity simply means 'differences'. People can be different in many ways. Some of the most obvious differences we may notice are age, gender, appearance, abilities, race or ethnicity, and religion.

When we talk about diversity in society, we usually mean including a range of people with different backgrounds and characteristics in a group.
