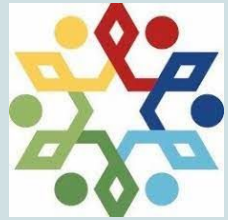

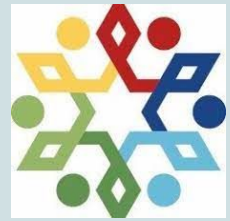
As we move into the second half of our second term here I am delighted to see just how many of our students are demonstrating our Ready. Respect, Safe curriculum in all that they do.

New Muster Points: No More Muddy Shoes!



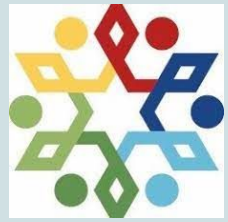
Due to the poor conditions on the school field, the Fire Muster Points will change with immediate effect.

Each member of the form with 100% attendance last week will receive merits

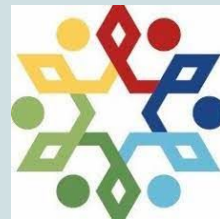

Get a head start on your learning!



- Every half term you will read a selection of challenging texts across all subjects.

- Read through the texts. Highlight any words you don't know. Do the words in the sentence help you to understand it better? Is the word in the glossary? Can you find the definition in the dictionary?
- This will develop comprehension skills, enhance your knowledge of key subjects and develop your confidence.

The Impact of Reading for Pleasure



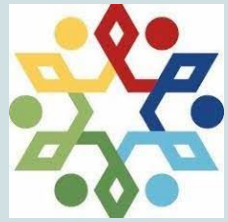
5 benefits of reading
