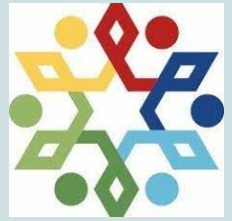


The Kingsway School Foxland Key Messages

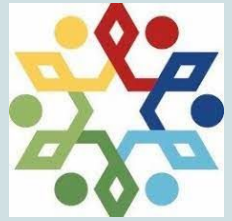

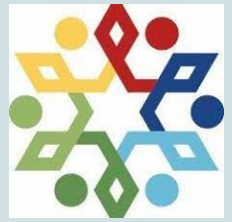

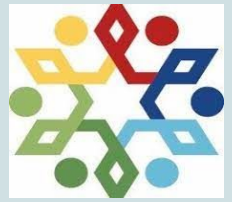
Between now and the end of the term, we will be appointing leaders in all years to support our Year 11 team. Please consider opportunities to be part of leading our school community.

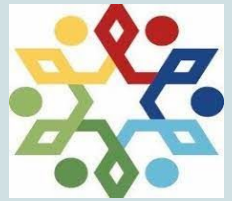


Diwali lanterns and remembrance poppies are similar because they are both symbols of peace and goodness after conflict and hatred.





Key Messages: Respect

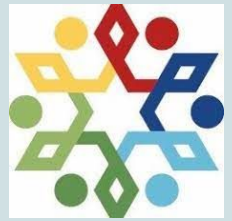

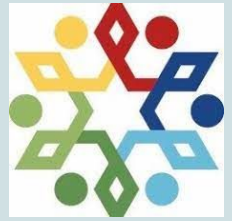

Essential Knowledge from Assembly



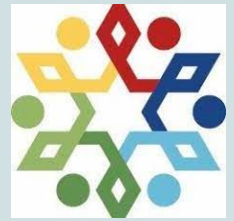
Remembrance is when we take time to honour the people who serve to defend our freedoms and keep us safe.
