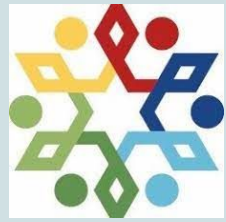


The Kingsway School Foxland Key Messages





Welcome Address



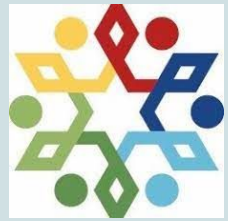

Plan this into your journey time and leave home earlier.

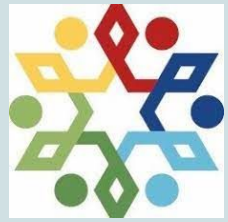
You are late to school if you cross the building's entrance after 8:30am

- Missed break detention will be upscaled to 30 minutes SDR.

Late to Lessons:

Everyone should be at their lessons on time.

When the bell goes you move to your next lesson straight away

Meet promptly in the canteen if you are being escorted to Broadway

Persistent lateness takes away from your learning time





Key Messages: Core Value (Respect)

Canteen Queues

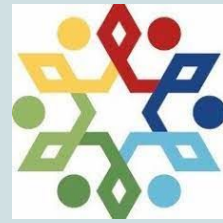
Well done to year 11 who demonstrated how to queue sensibly to get in to the canteen last week.

Key Messages: Core Value (Safe)



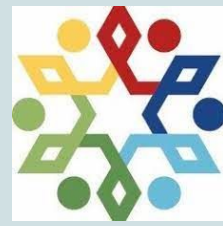
When crossing over to and from Broadway it is important for your safety that you use the crossing and do not cross the road until the light have turned to red.

At break times there are places for students to sit with their friends. Corridors and class rooms are out of bounds at break.

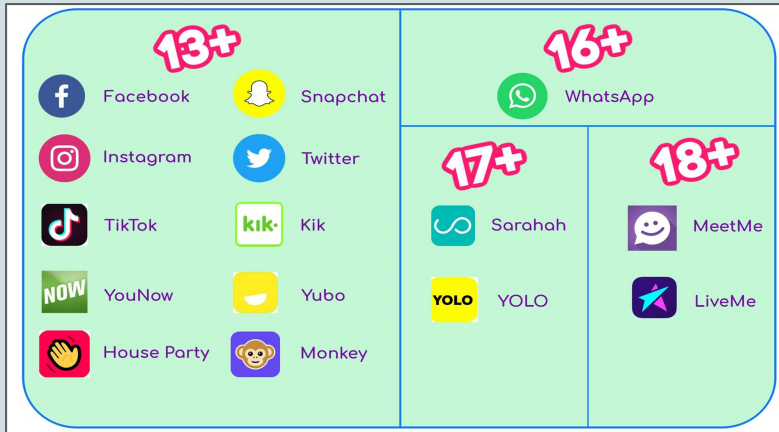
Please move around the school safely at all times. Those students who act boisterously will lose their social times.

Online safety



Sadly, last week the safeguarding team were alerted that an adult had pretended to be a child to befriend some of our Year 7s on Snapchat. The adult behaved in a very inappropriate way and has been reported to the police.



These age ratings help keep you safe. Last week, the government passed an Online Safety Bill - the first in the world. This will:

- Enforce age limits.
- Give clear ways for children to report bad things they experience online.
- Hold social media companies responsible for children seeing unsafe content.

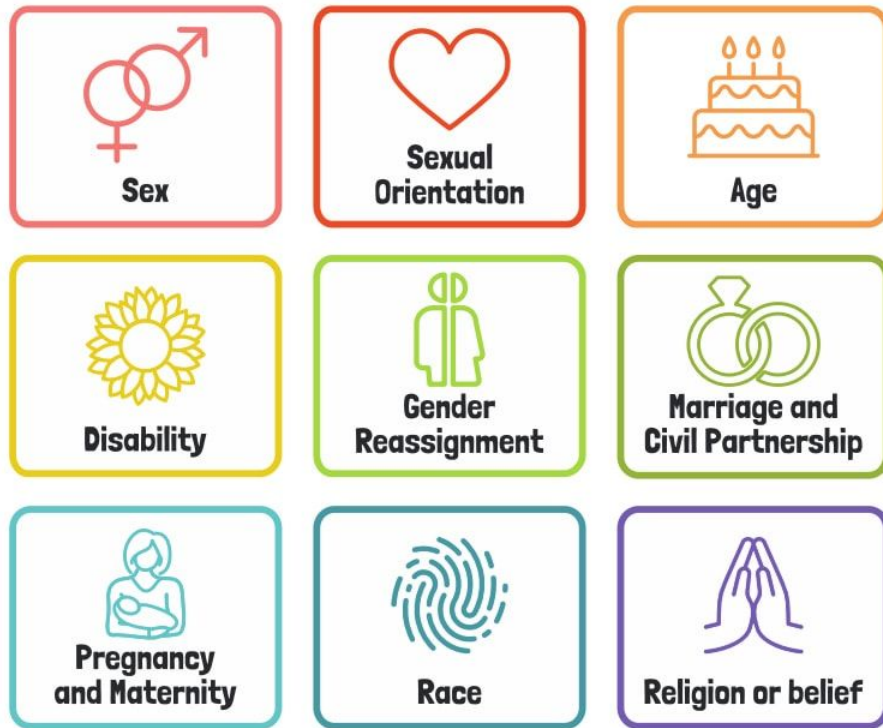
