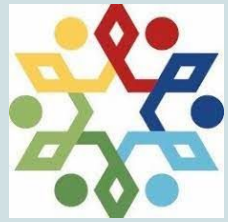

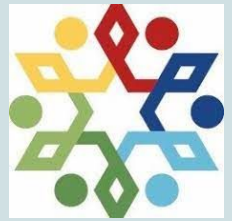
Use the 6 numbers in the given order to make a total of 100. You can use $+$ $-$ \times \div $()$.

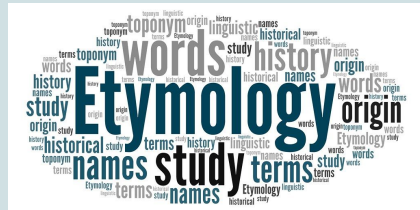
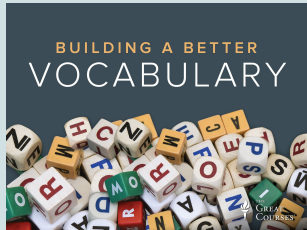

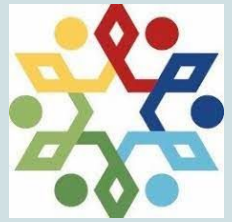
