Quality First Teaching



02 NEW MATERIAL IN SMALL STEPS



Our working memory is small, only handling a few bits of information at once. Avoid its overload — present new material in small steps and proceed only when first steps are mastered.

08 SCAFFOLDS FOR DIFFICULT TASKS



Scaffolds are temporary supports to assist learning. They can include modelling, teacher thinking aloud, cue cards and checklists. Scaffolds are part of cognitive apprenticeship.

Students need cognitive support to help them learn how to solve problems. Modelling, worked examples and teacher thinking out loud help clarify the specific steps involved.

09 INDEPENDENT PRACTICE



Independent practice produces 'overlearning' — a necessary process for new material to be recalled automatically. This ensures no overloading of students' working memory.

Transition





Over the summer term there have been lots of transition meetings taking place.

- We have been meeting with your class 6 teacher and school SENDCo.
- Information has been shared so we can prepare for your transition in the best way possible.
 - We are in the process of preparing this information to share with your teachers and staff, ready for September.
- Parents In September your child's SEND profile will be shared with you for to have the opportunity to make any changes.
- Any future changes to your child's SEND profile will be shared with you first.

How does Kingsway school Know that my child needs help?

All teachers at Kingsway School provide **quality first teaching** and are trained to support children with additional needs.

- •Some children require special educational provision beyond high quality adaptive teaching, which is additional to or different from that made for others of the same age.
- •Assessment for Learning allows us to gain essential information on abilities, progress and achievements via:
- •Key stage 2 data
- Teacher/SEND Support staff observations
- Marking of Work
- •Half termly/termly assessments
- Reviewing strengths, needs and experiences
- •Specialist SEN standardised assessments
- External Agency Assessments





Support throughout the year



If your child is on the SEN register they will be assigned a Provision Plan Coordinator.

This member of staff will be responsible for the monitoring and assessing of your child's SEN provision plan.

The Provision Plan Coordinator will carry out an annual review with yourself and your child to review their support, progress and needs.

You will have access to the Provision Plan Coordinator throughout the year to address any queries or concerns.





Support assistants



Learning Support Assistants - Our LSA Manager oversees the departments LSAs. These are members of staff deployed to support our students, both in and outside of the classroom.

<u>Resourced Integrated Support Assistants</u> - These members of staff support our Resource students in both the Resource base and mainstream.





Provision Plans

<u>What curriculum will my child</u> <u>be taught?</u>



We teach a varied and exciting curriculum, rooted in the importance of the core subjects: English, Maths and Science. We offer a unique creative approach to providing enrichment opportunities for our young people through access to the Arts, sport and other skills.

- •Through our curriculum, assemblies and the school ethos, pupils are taught PSHE
- Our SEND support structure offers additional programmes to support:
- Social and communication skills
- Life skills such as cooking
- •Awareness in the community
- Friendship groups
- Planning for further education and employment







Interventions will vary depending on the child's needs. The main areas of focus are:

The Inclusion and Diversity department has designated areas on both school campuses. There will always be a member of staff available in these places that can assist your child in seeking the help and the support they may need through the school day.







<u>Our Open door policy</u>

If you have any concerns about your your child's provision plan or SEN needs, please contact your child's co-ordinator at your earliest convenience. You will be sent a letter at the start of the year indicating who the coordinator is and how to contact them.





Cared-for and previously cared-for children



- Cared-for children will continue to be supported through Personal Education Planning (PEP) meetings each term.
- **Miss Hulance** is our Designated Teacher for cared-for children and attends all PEPs.
- School's are not automatically informed if a student is previously-cared for. We recommend that you inform us if your child is previously cared-for or if they live with you in a Special Guardianship arrangement because they may need more specific support as they progress through school and there are funds we can draw on to ensure these needs are met.



Wellbeing and mental health



All students receive:

- Social and emotional learning delivered through Wellbeing (PSHE) lessons.
- Support from form tutors and heads of year who have training in supporting emotional needs.
- Access to Wellbeing drop in sessions from the safeguarding team.

Those who need further support can be referred for:

- Sessions with our Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA).
- SEMH interventions in our Hub including anger management; self-esteem building; online safety and healthy relationships (these are reviewed according to needs and trends).
- School counselling.



Breaktime Provision



During breaktime, there will be a quieter supervised area available where students can go to eat their lunch, play board games, socialise and talk to key members of staff.





Homework Support



Homework can sometimes be challenging and stressful to some of our SEND learners. To support with this, our students will have access to additional support if necessary.

Parents/Carers are advised to use Classcharts to monitor and check homework set.

Please do let the school know if your child is struggling to meet their deadlines.





SEND Coffee Mornings



Each year we hold a SEND coffee morning. This is when parents/carers are given the opportunity to meet the team, network with other parents and share your views on your child's transition and progress.

FAQs - Students



Q - How does the Kingsway school know if I need extra help?

<u>Your teachers track your progress and they will know if you need extra help. They will also be aware of what extra help you have been receiving in year 6</u>

Q - Who can I talk to if I am worried about something at school?

Talk to your form tutor, the support staff, or any other familiar adult in the school.

Q - What should I do if I am struggling with my homework?

- Speak to your subject teacher as soon as you can and ask for support

Q - How do I find out what extra curricular activities are available?

- You can check the Enrichment timetable on Frog or ask your form tutor.





FAQs - Parents/carers



<u>Q</u> - Do you receive my child's SEN file from primary?

Initially we obtain information through transition meetings. Your child's files will be sent to the school at the end of this term.

Annual review

Ask for an appointment to speak with your child's tutor, Head of year, the SENDCo or IPP co-ordinator at a mutually convenient time.

Q What support will there be for my child's overall wellbeing?

.Each year has a Head of Year and Pastoral Head of Year who monitor your student's academic progress and emotional welfare. Students have access to one-to-one support from a key trusted adult if required.
