
Big Wins

500 students in Year 10 and 11 received positive merits last week.


Most merits were awarded for Good Learning and Good Attitude. Fantastic.


For girls Football and Netball , a member of PE staff will meet any girls who do not know where to go, near the changing rooms and will walk over to Foxland.
