








<u>Curriculum Intent</u>




Curriculum Sequencing

The documents also define the composite knowledge of 'complete end points' your child is expected to reach by the end of each topic and year.









Good old fashioned quizzing is an ideal vehicle to get students self-testing, which is proven to be a robust revision strategy, so that students can calibrate their knowledge and remembering. There are various types of quizzes, of course, such as short answer quizzing, multiple choice or a hybrid of the two, with different question types suiting different purposes.












Revision cards are a very common method of revision. They can be used to summarise essential knowledge and make it stick.

They are most effective when pupils use them for self testing using the method below or something similar.









Cornell notes pages are a common note taking method that supports recall. You can put recall clues in the margin and your main notes and summary can also be included.

How do we support your child:

- Interventions provided by class teachers
- Regular milestones with personalised feedback
- Therapy lessons based on QLA analyses
- Weekly Sparx maths tasks that include questions on current topics and recall of previous work
- Access to Sparx Independent Learning for further practice
- Walking Talking Mocks prior to PPE exams





How to support your child at home:

- Encourage 100% completion of Sparx maths each week as this includes retrieval practice
- Encourage the use of Sparx Independent learning particularly once students have received personalised feedback after a milestone assessment
- Encourage your child to prepare for milestone assessments by using the knowledge organisers
- Encourage attendance to any revision opportunities


