
## The national curriculum aims and objectives

The national curriculum for music aims to ensure that all pupils:

☐ perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions, including the works of the great composers and musicians

☐ learn to sing and to use their voices, to create and compose music on their own and with others, have the opportunity to learn a musical instrument, use technology appropriately and have the opportunity to progress to the next level of musical excellence

understand and explore how music is created, produced and communicated, including through the inter-related dimensions: pitch,



As your child moves through school, it is crucial that they learn and continue to practice key skills and understand key vocabulary.

<u>Pitch</u> - In music, the pitch of a note means how high or low the sound is.

<u>Volume</u> - In music, the volume refers to how loud the sound is - measured in decibels.

<u>Beat</u> - In music, the beat is refined as a rhythmic movement, or the speed at which a piece of music is played.

<u>Rhythm -</u> A combination in long and short sounds.

<u>Pulse</u> In music the term pulse relates to the number of beats in the song
