

Attendance

Our whole school attendance is currently 96.4%. Whilst attendance at The Meadows continues to be above national, we are still below our school target of at least 97%. We strive for this because we know that attendance is essential for children to achieve their potential. All research indicates that there is a direct correlation between strong attendance and positive academic achievement as well as **personal success.** This is what we want for all our children. We also know



that poor attendance can have a significant and long last impact on a pupils' education and future **life chances** – we do not want this for any of our children.

We know there are times when children rightly need to be at home because, for example, they have a high temperature or a sickness bug. However, these instances should be rare and should not have a significant impact upon a child's attendance. Attendance is essential for our children to thrive, both personally and academically.

We continue to have applications for holidays during term time, despite the significant change in national guidance and the financial and legal consequences the government have introduced. **Please be aware that holidays in term time will not be permitted.** Where we suspect children to be absent due to holidays not disclosed, the school will also follow the national guidance on fining procedures.

Please continue to support your child to attend school and remember that we are here to help if you have any concerns.

Bikeability

This week, the children in Y5 had the opportunity to participate in our Bikeability. This is a fantastic **programme that teaches our children how to stay safe when cycling** in the community, such as by checking their bikes are road worthy before they go on them, but also encourages them to develop new athletic skills, promoting healthy lifestyles. The instructors that led our sessions were incredibly impressed with the attitudes and behaviour of our children. It was brilliant to see their engagement and how much they learnt in such a short space of time. They were praised for their excellent **concentration** skills, one of our **'Secrets of Success'**. I was incredibly proud of you.
