Dear Parents/Carers,

Firstly, sincere apologies that this newsletter was not sent on Friday, as per usual. The general hustle and bustle of school life, particularly in light of staff absence, prevented me from sending it on time. Thank you, in advance, for your understanding.

Another week has passed, and we are now in the final few weeks of term. Last week was assessment week, where children across the school had the opportunity to show how much they have remembered of their learning so far in Maths, Reading, Writing and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar. We have been so impressed with the learning behaviours the children have demonstrated. They have worked incredibly hard, shown great concentration and have demonstrated real resilience – well done children.

At The Meadows, the children genuinely like the opportunity to show what they can do and approach assessments with enthusiasm and such a positive mentality. All that we ask the children to do is try their best, which they have certainly done last week. They know that this is a safe place to make mistakes and that mistakes are part of learning. Teachers will use the assessment data to help them to tailor their teaching and learning to the needs of the pupils. Over the course of the next few weeks, the children will also complete their end of term assessments in the foundation subjects too, to indicate how much knowledge they have retained over time.

Last week, it was fantastic to see Miss Sutcliffe, as she begins her phased return to school which will continue over the next few weeks, and Miss Parry, who is back full time from today. We are so pleased that they are recovering well and have missed them greatly. They are such wonderful members of our school team. The children were excited to see them, and I know both Miss Sutcliffe and Miss Parry have missed the children greatly.

RSPCA Fundraiser

A huge thank you for of the donations (both monetary and items) for the RSPCA on Friday. Our school community certainly demonstrated our school motto: 'Learning by caring and sharing'. It was wonderful to see the children come in animal themed clothing and show such positivity about the importance of looking after the world around us, in particular preventing cruelty against animals.

Polite Reminder - Drop Offs

Attendance

As you may be aware, promoting positive attendance is a high priority for us as a school, as well as for the government. All research suggests that there is a **direct correlation between strong attendance and a pupil's success, both personally and academically.** We are committed to supporting our families to ensure our pupils are in school each day because we are **relentless in our drive to ensure that our children lead successful, fulfilled lives.**

Our whole school **attendance remains at 96.4%.** Whilst attendance at The Meadows continues to be above national, we are still below our school target of at least 97%. **Well done to pupils in Y2 and Y3** as their attendance is at school target. This means that the children are in school consistently and are engaged with their daily learning opportunities. All other year groups require improvement.

Please continue to support your child to attend school daily and remember that

we are here to help if you have any concerns.

Polite Reminder - Nails

Each day, we praise our pupils for being 'Ready' for school (one of our school rules) such as being punctual, prepared for the day and looking smart in their uniform. However, we have had a few incidences recently where pupils are not adhering to our school dress code, which is in breach of our school behaviour policy. This is particularly the case with nails, where some children are waring nail varnish or even with long acrylic nails. This does not comply with our dress code, or our school rule of being 'safe', particularly for sports as it can be a health a safety issue when pupils are playing.

Please do all that you can to support your child to comply with school expectations and to prevent the breach in our behaviour policy. As a parent myself, I know how tricky it can be, but I also know that holiday times provide ample opportunity for children to wear nail varnish etc. This is the same expectation that will be enforced when your child/children go to high school too, for example Madeley High. We aim to prepare our children for secondary too. We also don't want our children to have to miss on vital learning opportunities for this reason. Many thanks for your support in this matter.

EYFS/KS1 Trip to Chester Zoo (Wed 2nd April)


