#### **Eco Warrior Update**

As you may be aware, we are currently working towards our school Eco status. Our Eco Warriors are working hard, alongside Mrs Magee, to help our school to be eco-friendly to protect the world around us. Our committee have their own news board, where minutes of their meetings can be found. The goals they have decided on this half term are:

- 1. To improve our playground for our local nature.
- 2. To reduce our energy consumption. They have selected light monitors to help with this and prompts have been put up around the school.
- 3. To introduce class plants to improve indoor air quality.

On Monday, in Eco Warrior club, they started to work on goal two by creating their own bird food (fat balls) that will be place around the school community to support our local birdlife.



## **TT Rockstars**

A letter was sent via Parentmail this week to launch TT Rockstars with our Key Stage 2 pupils (Owls and Hawks). This programme is aimed at supporting our pupils to develop automaticity in their time tables, so that they are committed to their long-term memories and can be applied in Maths and across the curriculum. We want our children to be able to recall them quickly, in less than 6 seconds. This will enhance FUN Maths provision. The Owls trialled the programme last term and their voice was incredibly positive. Here are some examples of their comments last term:



"It is fun and helps me to practice them quickly."

"It is a good way to build confidence."

"The games are fun, and I like that we will be able to challenge other people."

"I like that you can see the heatmap and that it changes colour so you know what to work on."

As a result of the fantastic results of the trial, and the impact on pupil retention and enthusiasm, we have rolled this out to all KS2 and will be implementing a similar programme Numbots (based on recall of number facts including number bonds) to our Kingfishers in the next few weeks too.

#### **IT Update**

At The Meadows, we know how important digital technology is to our school community – it is an essential part of our curriculum and teaching and learning because we want to create fantastic digital citizens of the future. To enhance our provision, we have been trialling a new hi spec Promethean board in the Kingfishers class. This demo will help us to ensure we purchase the best spec board for our provision.



Excitingly, we are also in the process of working with the Shaw Education Trust to roll out our new digital strategy, which will include all pupils having access to an individual Ipad. The aim is for this to be in place over the next month or so. We have worked hard to ensure that this happens and are incredibly thankful to the trust for their support and commitment to our school community.

#### **Sports Super Stars**

Huge congratulations to our athletes in Hawks class who took part in the Sportshall Athletic competition this week. The children participated in a range of track and field athletic events and were praised for their fantastic sportsmanship! Well done children for coming 3<sup>rd</sup> place. We are so proud of you and we know you certainly enjoyed this experience.




## **World Book Day**
