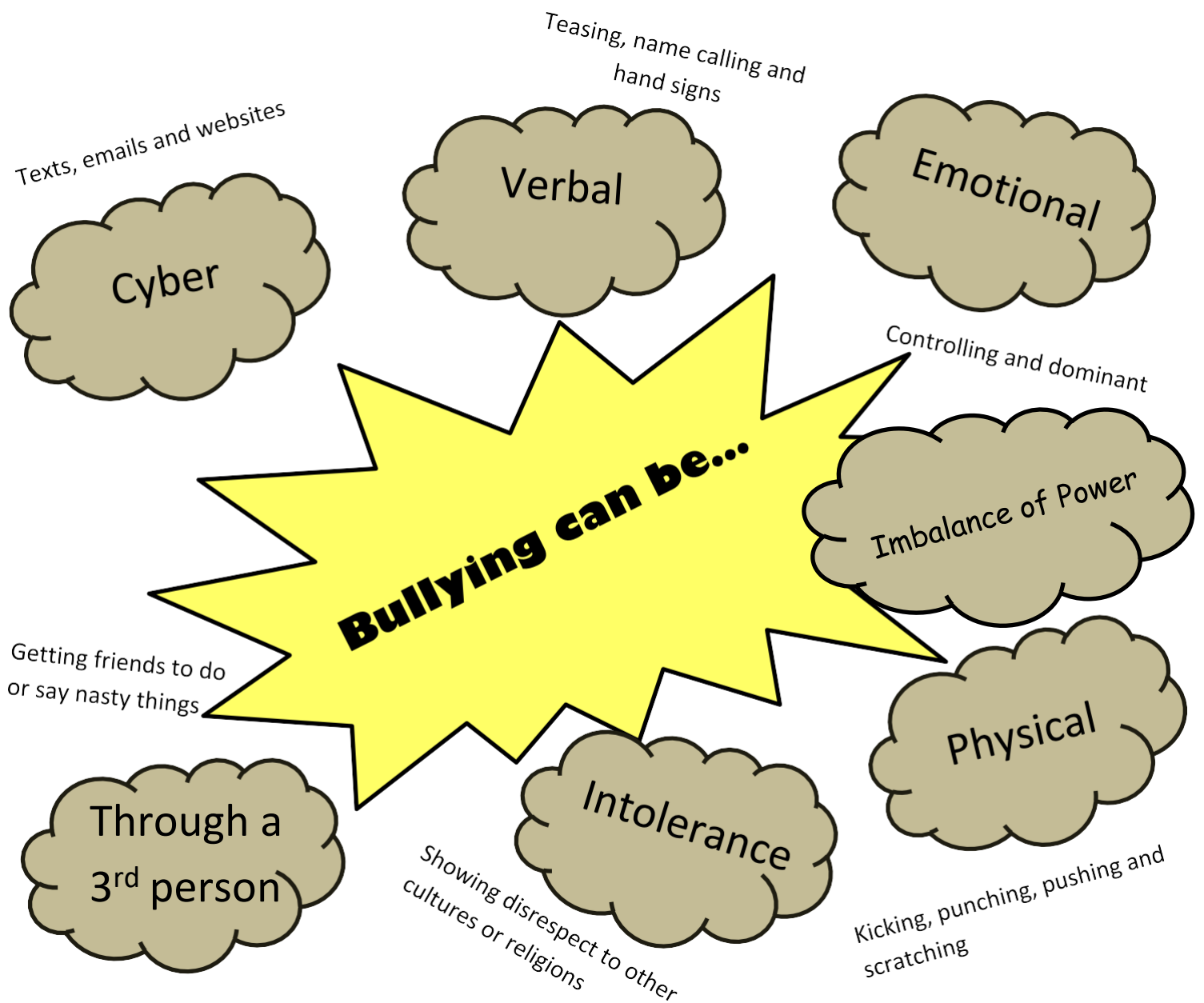

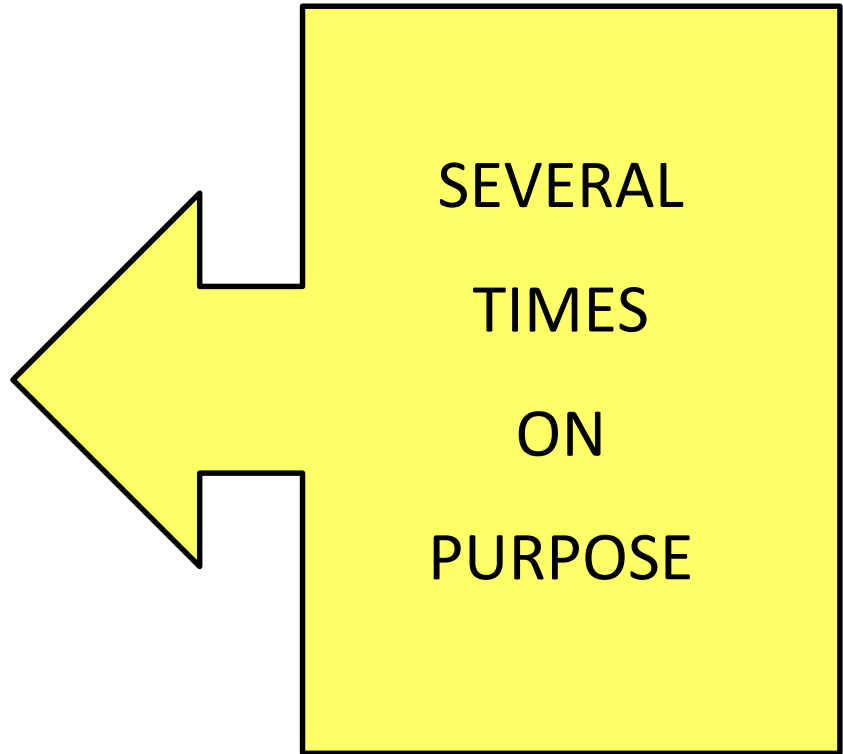

What is bullying?

At The Meadows Primary School, a bully is someone who hurts someone **more than once**, by using behaviour which is mean to hurt, frighten or upset another person.

What we do in school to help





We take bullying seriously and we find a way to make it **STOP**. We want you to feel safe and happy in school.

What should I do if I am being bullied?

- ✓ Use eye contact and tell them to go away.
- ✓ Ignore them.
- ✓ Walk away
- ✓ Act as though you don't care what they say or do.
- ✓ Remember, it is NOT YOUR fault.
- ✓ Tell an adult!



What should I do if I see someone else being bullied?

-  Don't walk away and ignore the bullying.
-  Let the bully know what is happening.
-  Tell the bully to S.T.O.P. if it is safe to do so.
-  Don't stay silent or the bullying will keep happening.



Together we can **STOP** bullying!
