Two councillors sold poppies to staff and the whole school. We observed the minute silence in honour of all the people who have fought in wars.

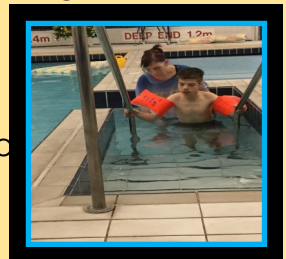


What's been going on in school?

Swimming Sessions

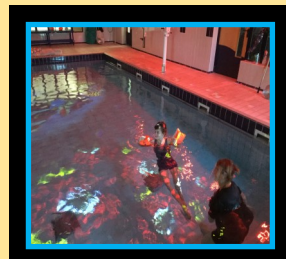
Some of our students have made fantastic progress in their swimming sessions.

Mehdi swam confidently on his tummy with assistance and hopefully will soon be able to do this with just his armbands and vocal guidance.

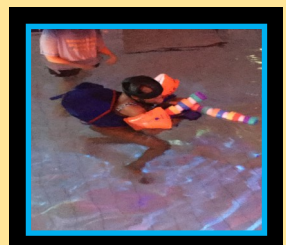
Maisy adores the water and enjoys floating. She has shown more interest in the light show and interacted with it and us more, responding to our voices and laughing with us during her water sessions.



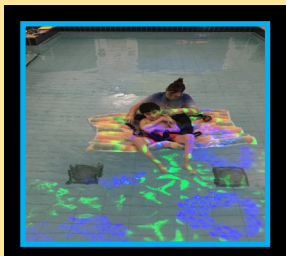
Joey is always happy and relaxed with the water being trickled over his body. He has shown less anticipation when the water falls onto his skin.

KS4 Science Day

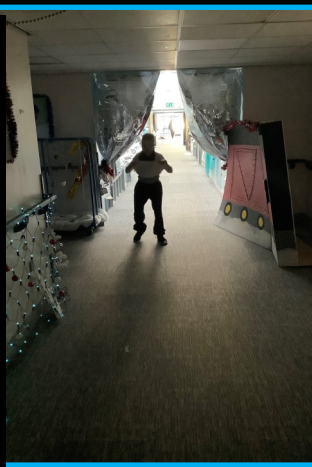

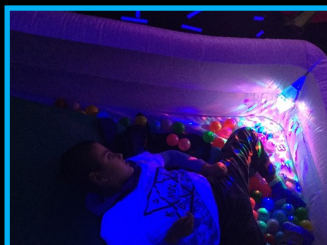
