What a fantastic week we had at The Meadows School for Careers Week. The young people really did experience and explore the world of work. On Monday 7th March, we

welcomed the Animal Man to come and show us some animals and talk to us about his work looking after these animals. The response from the young people was AMAZING.

Throughout the week, we took part in a variety of differen work experiences throughout the school including office work, litter picking to support our local community in keeping the environment clean and tidy, domestic duties around the school and maintenance work to keep our school safe. During the week, each class took part in a mini enterprise project. Each class selected a project and worked as a team to create their item to sell on celebration day or Friday 11th March. We welcomed visitors to join us for the event. Our young people did a tour of the school and we al joined in the Dining Room to see the wonderful creations they had made. Each young person participated and it was a joyous occasion. The school has raised over £600 towards all our new adventures coming in the future!


FESTIVAL OF COLOUR

Safeguarding & Pastoral Updates

Online Safety

Recently, we have had several incidents of students having been using the internet unsupervised and they have at times been doing things online that could put them at risk. Please be aware that children with SEND can be more vulnerable to internet grooming and exploitation of different kinds. One tip is that if you do allow your child to use social media, make sure they only use it on a shared family device and when you are around to monitor what they are viewing and who they are talking to.





Resources to help you talk about Online Safety with your child:

If you search on Youtube for the NSPCC video called 'Share Aware Lucy and the Boy', this is a great video that helps explain to parents/carers and young people about the risks of talking to strangers online - and of sharing pictures with them. It is simple, short and brightly-coloured and depending on your child's level of understanding, is a good way to talk to them about making sure they do not go online without adult supervision.

National Online Safety is a fantastic organisation that creates helpful resources for schools and parents/carers around Online Safety. They even have a free app that you can download to your phone which we would recommend doing. The app has a huge list of websites and games that young people use online and explains what they are, how they work, the risks associated with them and how to use them in a safer way.

The NSPCC website has a brilliant section called 'Use Parental Controls to Keep Your Child Safe' where it explains how to set up parental controls and filters on all your devices. However, you can also go into any O2 shop (whether or not you are an O2 customer), and they can help you to set up parental controls on your devices. While not 100% perfect (you still need to monitor your child when they're online), they can help filter out inappropriate,

Online Safety Coffee Morning—Wednesday 27th April

On Wednesday 27th April at 9:30am, we are holding an Online Safety Coffee Morning for all parents and carers. During the Coffee Morning, one of our Safeguarding Officers will be conducting a short presentation on Online Safety for children with SEND, looking at the specific risks that can face our young people. There will be plenty of time to ask questions and get some practical advice



around safeguarding your child online. If you would like to attend, just contact school reception to put your name down as we have limited spaces.

Operation Encompass

Since 2018, as a school we have taken part in a project run jointly between schools and Sandwell Police.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to 9am on the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.



Supporting children through key adults

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the Police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

If you have any questions about Operation Encompass, or have any concerns about domestic abuse and would like our advice and support, please do not hesitate to contact the Pastoral Team here at school.

Food Bank Vouchers

The Pastoral Team are currently in the process of becoming voucherdistributors for the local Food Bank. This means parents/carers of students at The Meadows can approach the school if you are in need of a voucher for a food parcel from the Black Country Food Bank, which has branches
