DfE Key Updates

<u>Shielding Guidance:</u> The government has <u>announced</u> that shielding guidance is being paused. From Thursday 1 April, Clinically Extremely

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Vulnerable (CEV) people are no longer advised to shield. CEV people must continue to follow the <u>national restrictions</u> that are in place for everyone. From Thursday 1 April, all CEV children should attend early years provision, school, college, wraparound childcare and out-of-school settings, unless they are one of the very small number of children under paediatric or other specialist care and have been advised by their GP or clinician not to attend.

National Survey from Children's Commissioner: The new Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has begun a major review of the future of childhood, which will address the barriers holding children back in the 21st century. This review begins with 'The Big Ask': the largest ever survey of children in England, to gather children's views on what the government should prioritise in planning the recovery from the pandemic. The Big Ask will be launched on Monday 19 April in the form of a short online questionnaire. Schools will receive a link to the questionnaire shortly after it has launched. We encourage you to share it with as many students as possible.

<u>Examination Centres – Private Candidates:</u> There is support available to examination centres to assist private candidates gain their qualifications. Further information can be found in the <u>private candidate support grant</u> quidance.

The Healthy Children Programme 0-19 Health Visitors & School Nurses commissioning guidance has been released: See link here. The guidance has been republished to reflect new evidence and guidance to support local authorities commissioning 'public health services for children and young people' and in particular delivering the healthy child programme 0 to 5 and 5 to 19. It focuses on the contribution of health visiting and school nursing services leading and co-ordinating the delivery of public health for children aged 0 to 19. The healthy child programme aims to bring together health, education and other main partners to deliver an effective programme for prevention and support.

Parents Refusing to have Children COVID Tested

As you know, there may be some parents who are reluctant to have their children COVID tested even though they have developed symptoms. This

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can of course be very disruptive for schools as the whole group of children in a bubble may be affected and have to self-isolate for ten days. To assist with these cases Sandwell Public Health has produced a letter which you can share with parents if, and when, necessary. Please see attached letter.

Also, it may be worth reminding your own staff that <u>if they have COVID</u> <u>symptoms</u> then they should still self isolate and book a PCR test as LFD testing is designed for use with people who do not have symptoms.

Important Update - Devices distributed through the Get Help with Technology Scheme

Devices provided to you through the DfE Get Help with Technology programme came with Microsoft Intune installed. As some of the devices provided have not connected to the Microsoft server for a considerable period of time, the certificate for this software will expire soon. When this certificate lapses the DfE will be unable to manage the devices and apply safeguarding and content filtering settings. Regular connection of your devices to Intune ensures that certificates are refreshed and will not expire. If you have reset the devices and installed your own device management software. You do not need to take any further action.

If you still need devices to have DfE settings installed: DfE settings for all devices will end on 30 September 2021. To continue to use DfE's temporary device management solution, arrange for your devices to connect to the internet immediately to have their certificate renewed. To prepare for device management from 1 October 2021, we would encourage you to apply your own device management software and security settings as soon as possible. This can be done at any time.

<u>DFE Get Help with Technology Survey:</u> Since March 2020, the DFE has been providing laptops and tablets, routers and mobile data uplifts to support children's remote learning during the pandemic. Could you please share the following link to those families that have benefited from the scheme <u>a 5–10-minute survey</u>.
