During the visit, our students were able to take part in taster work experience activities in accommodation services, front of house and food preparation tasks to truly immerse them in a student experience.



At The Meadows school, we work in partnership in Operation Encompass with West Midlands Police.

Operation Encompass

Supporting children through key adults

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools prior to the start of the next school day, when a

child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident. Sometimes, we get notifications that there has been an incident in the household even though the child was not present at the time, because they are registered as living at that address.

Operation Encompass ensures that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the local authority and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support children. It helps us to ensure that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident. Children might seem more withdrawn, worried, anxious, agitated or angry that normal.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved, and may contact you to ask if there is anything we can do to support. If you have any questions, please call school and ask to speak with a member of the Safeguarding Team.

Please can parents and carers take care when sending food in with students and refrain from sending anything which may contain nuts.
