Our students have been remarkable in their dedication and enthusiasm. A major highlight has been our focus on *Preparation for Adulthood*. Students have embraced activities that develop key life skills, such as cooking, shopping for essentials, travel training, and vocational experiences. These activities build confidence and empower our students to navigate the world more independently.

In the classrooms, we've seen wonderful creative projects, most notably the fashion topic that has been followed by key stage 3. This culminated in a fashion extravaganza, with students from across years 7, 8 and 9 modelling their creations on the cat-walk in front of a live audience!

I am thrilled to be able to start sharing information about our planned large-scale improvements. These projects are designed to enhance learning, play, and sensory experiences for all students.

Outdoor Play Areas: First drafts of our new playground designs are being reviewed by staff and students to ensure we creating an area that is fully accessible, engaging, and inclusive. This will allow students to explore, move, and interact in new and exciting ways.

Indoor Sensory Spaces: Plans are underway to revamp our indoor sensory rooms too! These spaces will provide calming, stimulating, and enriching experiences, tailored to the individual needs of our students.

We believe these developments will have a lasting impact on both the well-being and the learning potential of everyone in school. We will keep you updated as these projects progress, and will be seeking your vital input soon (Initial images below).

Will the road works ever be finished?



What an exciting Spring 1 term for Class 4:5!

We have enjoyed our shopping trips out in the community to Sainsburys. We really enjoy using public transport and our safety awareness in the community has been fantastic! In Sainsburys, the students have been locating items to purchase for our cooking sessions and learned how to use a self-service checkout. In Cooking, the focus this term has been making hot drinks and simple snacks e.g. teas, hot chocolate, beans on toast, soup with bread and butter and angel delight cheesecake. In Science, the students are studying Variation and Adaptation, we looked at live minibeasts of the same species to compare the differences. In P.E this term, the theme was Composing and Performing Dance, which ties in nicely with our Tuesday lunchtime Dance Club. The students have been learning simple dance moves and performing routines. In Maths, the students have been understanding the concept of doubling and halving. We are looking forward to our trip to Forge Mill Farm to support our learning in English on Farm Animals, which is based on non-fiction text.

Class 5.7


Class 5.7 have been going into the community and using money. We have been to, Sainsbury's, Greggs and Costa exchanging money to purchase our preferred snacks and drinks.

This is an encounter with an education setting for our young people to prepare for life beyond the Meadows (Post-19). Today, students took part in a snack exchange. This was a opportunity to use communication outside the classroom and to show appropriate interactions with new people. This forms part of careers strategy to meet Gatsby Benchmarks. Benchmark 7 - a meaningful encounter with providers. Class 5.6 — Queen Alexander College Visit


