












Class 3.2

Emergency Government Mobile Allerts



You may have heard in the news about emergency alerts that the government is trialling in order to let people know if an emergency situation has arisen in their area. There will be test of this service on the evening of Sunday 23rd April whereby all mobile phones that are switched on should receive an emergency alert. Remember, if for any reason someone has a secret phone (that needs to be hidden from an abusive partner for example), the NHS are reminding them to ensure it is switched off or turned onto airplane mode that evening so the emergency alert does not sound and make everyone aware of the phone.
