Amazing job, well done!



The Children's Christmas Jumper Day. Students and staff donned their most festive attire and brought in money for the charity, raising over £115. Thank you all for your contributions.


















CHILDREN IN NEED & SUPERHERO DAY

PLEASE BE AWARE WE HAVE A "NO-NUT" POLICY.

Please can parents and carers take care when sending food in with students and refrain from sending anything which may contain nuts.

Attendance in school is crucial to the progress students can make. We all want what is best for our children and so it is vital that students attend school unless they are absolutely too unwell. We understand that hospital and other medical appointments impact upon attendance and these are difficult to arrange out of school time, so we remind you to send in the evidence of these appointments so that the absence can be authorised. The table below will help you to understand what impact poor attendance can have on a student's progress:

Percentage	Days Absence	Comment	Achievement
Above 97%	Less than 6 days absence per year	Excellent Attendance	These children will al- most certainly achieve their full potential in school
95-96%	10 days absence per year	Missing 2 weeks of school every year	These children are likely to achieve but could still improve their attendance!
90%-94%	19 days absence per year	Missing one month of school every year	These children will find it hard to achieve their best in school
85%-89%	29 days absence per year	Missing six weeks of school every year	These children will find it very difficult to keep up with work in school and are unlikely to achieve their potential
80-84%	38 days absence per year	Missing a year of school over the time spent in secondary education	These children will find it almost impossible to keep up with their work

For "Health and Relationship Education: Information Sharing and Myth Busting" Coffee Morning.


