


The Meadows School

The festivities continued with all students enjoying a Christmas dinner served by SLT!














During this half term, classes have also been

Safeguarding Updates

Festive Safety

The festive season is upon us and you may already have started celebrating.

If you've ever spent Christmas Eve in A&E, you'll know that the festive season can bring about more accidents than usual. Please see below for some simple safety tips to make sure everyone has a magical time.

 We are all trying to save money amidst the current cost of living crisis and it's good value (plus good for the environment) to buy second



-hand. However, toy safety is paramount and sometimes second-hand toys can lack the correct instructions or be damaged. To learn more about toy safety, you can click on the link below from RoSPA (The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents).

- 2. It's worth considering purchasing gifts that are suitable for your child's developmental age, rather than chronological age as some children with SEND may struggle to understand how to use some toys (particularly electrical ones) in a safe way.
- 3. Look out for small items that could pose a choking hazard to children, such as <u>button batteries</u>, which if not caught early, can do serious damage to the gastrointestinal system. Never leave these items lying around and make sure that children know not to put them in their mouths, ears or up their noses. If your child likes to insert items, ensure these are completely out of reach.
- 4. Make sure you test any festive lights, and check for any broken bulbs. Turn off festive lights when you go to bed and don't overload plug sockets.
- 5. Do not drink and drive, and plan long journeys so you won't be driving tired.
- 6. You may or may not choose to drink alcohol but if booze will be around, ensure it is out of reach of your child. And check the ingredients on festive sweets, chocolates and desserts as some can have a high alcohol content!

Staying Away

If you are planning to go and stay with family or friends over the festive season, it may be worth spending some time helping your child to prepare. Some children with SEND can struggle with change and being out of routine and may find this stressful. You may wish to try some of the following:

- Tell your child ahead of time that you will be sleeping somewhere else but then coming home again. You know your child best and will be able to work out if it's best to give them lots of notice or tell them close to leaving time.
- Consider taking your child's own (not clean) bedding with them so as they sleep, there is a familiar smell.
- You could take pictures of your home and together with your child, tick off on a calendar how many days until you return.

Cost of Living Crisis

As the nights draw in and the temperature drops, you may find yourself worrying about the cost of heating your home.

Online Safety

As you have a chance to spend some more quality time together as a family, it can be a good idea to focus on online safety and make some New Years' Resolutions around internet use. A great place to start is this animated



series of 3 episodes called Jessie and Friends. Designed for 4-7 year olds, this is a child-friendly, age-appropriate way of teaching children about online harms and particularly online sexual abuse.

Mental Health



A study of 2,000 people, by the National Accident Helpline showed that 1 in 4 (27%) feel more stressed than usual during the festive period, rising to nearly a third (32%) among women.
