Safeguarding & Pastoral Updates

It is hard to believe that it is the last safeguarding and pastoral update of the academic year.

There are of course, a few things to make you aware of as parents/carers, in order to ensure that yours and your child's Summer is as safe and fun as can be.



Firstly, if you are heading away on holiday or perhaps will be visiting any open water (seaside, rivers, lakes etc), it is vital to consider water safety. The Royal Lifesaving Society have created a helpful, free booklet for parents/carers which can be downloaded here:

Here are some other top tips to consider when taking a child with SEND near open water:



1. Talk to your child beforehand about what sort of water it is. They may view any open water as a chance to swim and not understand that some water is not safe to swim in.

2. Consider walking next to the water yourself, with your child on the other side of you, away from the edge. Ensure that there is enough space between you and the water's edge that if you do stumble, you don't fall in and drag your child along with you.

Remember that water reflects the sunlight so even if the day appears overcast, ensure your child has protective sun wear and high SPF sun cream on.

Secondly, Summer can be a time when children and young people spend more time online. This is a marvellous way for them to keep in touch with friends and family and to watch some engaging content.



The Digiduck Stories, are a series of stories created for children age 3-7 that help them learn about online safety. You can find them on the link below. If you feel your child would be able to engage with these stories, why not have a look through them together and chat through your thoughts afterwards. They are a useful way to start talking about issues such as not sharing personal information, spotting 'fake news' and making online friends.

Finally, there has been lots of research into the impact of social media on young people's mental health. Perhaps not surprisingly, the



research has found that there is a link between social media use and anxiety and depression amongst young people – but particularly girls.

If your child uses social media (including Whatsapp and Youtube) or even uses your social media account, it is worth talking to them about this issue.
