With support from the governing body and the school improvement officer, we have embarked on the development of a new curriculum framework to support personalised EHCP targets; we are aiming to offer a curriculum that is consistent and is appropriate to the needs of our students across three pathways and all key stages.

Alongside this, we are putting in place a new assessment framework, which supports the curriculum model to map progress across all ages and abilities.

The new curriculum has been organised across five 'bubbles' which correspond with the five areas of the EHCPs.
