The Importance of Literacy



Reading with your child

Reading to and with your child regularly – ideally every evening for at least fifteen minutes - can make a dramatic difference to a child's achievement within school. A report from the Oxford University Press highlights the importance of parents reading with their children thus: "Children who read outside of class are 13 times more likely to read above the expected level for their age." Furthermore, pupils who spend time reading outside of school achieve better grades at GCSE and are more confident with the demands of college, university and the world of work.

The report also offers six tips for reading with your child at home:

- 1. Make time to read to your child for fifteen minutes a day.
- 2. Choose a variety of fictional and non-fictional books to read.
- 3. Take turns reading with your child.
- 4. Talk about the book- stop at several points in the story and ask your child what he/she thinks will happen next.
- 5. Pay attention to the language and encourage your child to use a dictionary or the internet to check the definition of words they may not understand.
- 6. Enjoy reading!

All pupils in Years 7 and 8 have extra time on their timetable for reading lessons. The school would very much appreciate your support in ensuring that your child is engaging with reading at home. Please make time in the evening for your child to read a suitable book with you.

Academic Literacy Interventions

As a school we have introduced Accelerated Reader to our Year 7's and Year 8's. It is an exciting reading programme used nationally to encourage students to read while also challenging them to improve their comprehension skills and read challenging books. Students take a reading test which gives each student a guide to the level of book they should be reading. They then read the book, and once finished take a quiz on what happened in the story; if they pass they gain points which at The Oaks Academy means prizes! To support your child to meet their reading goals you can ask them what they are currently reading and talk about what has happened in the story so far, you can also encourage them to come to The Oaks Learning Resource Centre regularly to borrow books at the right level for them.

We have also introduced Lexia for all Year 7 and Year 8. Lexia is a software programme which is proven to improve students literacy levels. It works on areas such as word meaning and grammar. When students first use the software they are assessed for their level, and then the programme automatically adapts to be at the right level of challenge. This means that students in the same class will be seeing different questions depending on their own personal ability. This ensures that each student is allowed to progress at their own pace, and their progression is monitored. All students in Year 7 and Year 8 are expected to complete at least 30 minutes a week using Lexia; once a fortnight students will have time to complete this during Form time. Students are welcome to complete the rest during break, lunch or after school in the LRC or from home. Please encourage your child to do at least ??? minutes per week at home as this will really support their literacy levels.

We are also pleased to let you know that The Oaks now have their own e-library! Students will be able to access and borrow e-books from home onto to read on any electronic device using their school log-in information. The link is below; happy reading!

Culture for Learning



We are working hard to create the right culture for learning at our school, so that students are safe, happy and achieve their goals. The Oaks Academy is the best performing non-faith school in Crewe for GCSE Progress 8 in 2022, this is a record we want to maintain. We have launched a **new RESPECT policy** to emphasise the values, expectations, behaviours and attitudes we expect from all our students.

Respect

- We expect all members of staff, students, and visitors to be treated with respect.
- This means speaking politely (including please and thank you)
- · Walking safely around the school and keeping to the left in corridors

- Following instructions first time.
- Allowing everyone to learn and feel safe.

Rewards

We want to continue to reward students who get this right day in and out. All staff are now logging positive points when students demonstrate the RESPECT values in their lessons and on corridors. These points can be tracked and monitored by staff, students and parents via the satchel one app. This is the same app that is used to track homework, and we would like to encourage all members of our community to use this to support individual progress. It's a great way to keep up to date with your child progress and support them in making good decisions. Positive points will be received at key interval and will contribute towards prizes at the end of each half term.

Attendance

- Students must arrive at school by 8.30am. The main school gate will open from 8.10am.
- · Academic and future success starts with excellent attendance.
- Attendance at 97% means your child has up to 6 days absence from school.

• If your child is ill or absent for a reason, please phone or email the school office. It is essential we know where your child is at all times.

· If your child truants when in school, this is a safeguarding matter.

You will be informed and your child will make up their lost learning time in detention.

Punctuality

- Students must be on time to form and to all lessons.
- Late marks are recorded; students will make up lost time.
- Punctuality is a life skill and students need manage their time effectively.

Uniform and equipment

• Students must wear the correct uniform at all times; this includes school shoes, blazer and a tie. If you have a problem obtaining uniform, please let us know via phone or email.

- · Coats must be taken off in the building.
- · Jewellery, except for one set of small stud earrings, is not allowed.
- · Students must bring the right equipment every day; pen, pencil etc

• Mobile phones must be switched off and out of sight while in school. If they are seen, staff will confiscate them and return them at the end of the day. You may be contacted about this.

Behaviour for learning

• In lessons, students must follow instructions, sit where they are told and only talk about their learning, to allow everyone to succeed.

• They must complete all work to the best of their ability.

Behaviour in the building

 \cdot $\,$ In corridors, students must keep to the left and walk sensibly to lessons, taking the quickest route.

- Students can only use toilets during lessons if they have a pass / medical need.
- There are toilets for KS3 and KS4 students should use the toilets for their year group.

National Apprenticeship Week - 6.2.23

Last week was National Apprenticeship week. To raise the profile of apprenticeships students has form tutor led sessions and assemblies form local employers and The Cheshire & Warrington Pledge. To support personalised pathways years 9-11 students were able to opt in to a career theme of their choice and we were delighted to have local employers join us for the assemblies to talk about their job roles and apprenticeships on offer.

Our Wednesday the assembly was themed around the NHS, which is one of the largest employers in our local area. Students were presented with a range of roles that they could apply for apprenticeships in and the different levels of apprenticeship that they can apply for.

Thursday's assembly was themed around Construction and were delighted to welcome in 4 different organisations, Arriva Trains, ISG, Qualkem and Linx Construction. It was great to hear about the diverse roles that are on offer and the many opportunities that they can lead to both locally and internationally.

Fridays assembly was on the theme of Business. One of the largest employers in our area, Likewise, were invited in to share their apprenticeships that they offer. Students were able to hear from one of their staff who had herself taken this route in her career, and they were given great advice on how to make their application stand out from the crowd.

Across all the assemblies' students listened well and showed a real interest in learning from our local labour market. It was a great success and something we will look to develop more in the future.
