Just Play (Keyboard, Ukulele and Vocal Performance Skills)

Key Words

Right Hand Melody Keyboard Finger Patterns = the notes that each finger should play in a piece so that you play using all your fingers to improve your keyboard playing technique

Sharps = raise notes by 1 semitone

Flats = lower notes by 1 semitone

Left Hand Accompaniment Keyboard Finger Patterns = the notes that each finger should play in a piece so that you play using all your fingers to improve your keyboard playing technique

Keyboard Note Names = CDEFGAB

Strumming Techniques = the position you hold your hand in when strumming

Strumming Patterns = the way the chords are strumming using up strums and down strums

Frets = the metal bars that split the neck of the ukulele into sections

Chords = 2 or more notes played at the same time


Palm Muting = stopping the ringing sound of the strummed strings with your hand


Unison = singers singing the same vocal part

Part Singing = singers singing different vocal parts to each other with harmonies
