5 steps to Risk Assessment

- 1. Identify the hazards
- 2. Decide who may be harmed
- 3. Identify the control measure already in place
- 4. Evaluate the remaining risk (High, Medium, Low)


5. Identify any further action needed to reduce the risk to the lowest *reasonably practicable* level

This has been agreed with the cleaning team and site staff - This is conducted daily Communal dining areas will be cleaned down. Sufficient cleaning supplies are in place throughout the school and checked on a weekly basis by the site manager. Door wedges are used, in all classrooms, to keep doors open/ajar, where appropriate. All windows in classrooms and corridors will remain open at all times to ensure appropriate ventilation. Classroom windows will be open fully at breaks and lunchtimes.	Continual reinforcement of guidance to keep doors open when teaching comes from SLT and FLs. This is a school requirement for each day. Students can wear appropriate clothing in classrooms if ventilation lowers temperature. Managed by classroom teacher.
