<b>Beliefs</b>	An acceptance that something exists or is true without proof or evidence.
<b>Facts</b>	a thing that is known or proved to be true.
<b>Team work</b>	the combined action of a group, especially when effective, usually to complete a task.
<b>Monotheistic</b>	Believing in only one God.
<b>Time-chart</b>	Showing the standard times something begins and continues over time. Basic chronology.


## Greek Mythology

<b>Zeus</b>	Supreme God. Protector and ruler of humankind, the dispenser of good and evil. Also God of weather.
<b>Hades</b>	God of the underworld. Brother of Zeus.
<b>Poseidon</b>	the god of the sea, water, earthquakes. Brother of Zeus



<b>Semitic</b>	Relating to the area or peoples who speak Semitic languages, especially Hebrew and Arabic.
<b>Judaism</b>	Monotheistic religion of the Jewish people.
<b>Christianity</b>	Monotheistic religion based on Jesus Christ, its beliefs and practices.
<b>Islam</b>	Monotheistic religion of the Muslim people, revealed by Muhammad as Allah’s Prophet.
<b>Abraham</b>	the Father of Many. Key link to All the Semitic religions.
<b>Moses</b>	Key Prophet in all Semitic religions.
<b>Synagogue</b>	A Jewish religious building of worship.
<b>Burqa</b>	A garment covering the whole body from head to feet, worn in public by women in many Muslim countries.
<b>Five Pillars of Islam</b>	The main beliefs of the Islamic Faith.
<b>Christmas</b>	Major Christian festival. About the birth of Christ

**Shahadah**  
(Faith)

To believe in no God but Allah and that Muhammad is his prophet and the messenger of Allah.

الصلاة

**Salah**  
(Prayer)

To pray five times each day:  
 Fajr - Before Sunrise  
 Zuhr - Early Afternoon  
 Asr - Late Afternoon  
 Maghrib - After Sunset  
 Isha - Night.

الصوم

**Sawm**  
(Fasting)

To give up food and drink during daylight hours in the month of Ramadan.

الزكاة

**Zakah**  
(Almsgiving)

To give a share of personal wealth to help people in need and support the Muslim community.

الحج

**Haji**  
(Pilgrimage)

To perform a pilgrimage to Makkah at least once in a lifetime.

<b>Sikhism</b>	A monotheistic religion founded in Punjab in the 15th century by Guru Nanak.
<b>Polytheism</b>	Believing in many God's
<b>Samsara</b>	the cycle of death and rebirth.
<b>Rebirth</b>	the process of being reincarnated or born again
<b>reincarnation</b>	the rebirth of a soul in another body.
<b>Brahman</b>	Supreme cosmic Spirit in Hinduism.
<b>Buddha</b>	Siddhartha Gotama the founder of Buddhism.
<b>Tibet</b>	A large autonomous area of China.
<b>Dalai Lama</b>	Spiritual leader of the Tibetan people.
<b>Gurdwara</b>	Sikh holy building of worship.
<b>The Five K's</b>	Five items that Sikh's wear to remind them of their faith.



<b>Anatta</b>	No soul. No fixed self.







<b>Protestant</b>	second-largest form of Christianity with a total of 800 million.
<b>Omnipotent</b>	God is all-powerful.
<b>Omniscient</b>	God is all-knowing.
<b>Trinity</b>	One God who takes three persons. Father, Son, Spirit.
<b>Creationism</b>	God created the world and everything in it in 6 days. Genesis.
<b>Incarnation</b>	God became a man in the form of Jesus. Becoming flesh.
<b>Crucifixion</b>	Jesus was put to death on a cross.
<b>Resurrection</b>	Key Belief that Jesus rose from the dead.

<b>MLK DAY</b>	A Bank Holiday day of service in USA.
<b>Bus Boycott</b>	political and social protest campaign against the policy of racial segregation on the public transit system of Montgomery.
<b>Love</b>	A powerful emotion of Goodwill to all people.
<b>Segregation</b>	Different laws keeping Black and White people apart.
<b>Racism</b>	Thinking one race is more superior than another.
<b>Service</b>	Giving your time and abilities to help others.
<b>Stewardship</b>	Caring for the planet and people on behalf of God.
<b>Malcolm X</b>	Black Civil rights campaigner in 1950's USA.
