Re: Returning to the Academy – September 2023

I cannot quite believe that another school year is coming to a close – they seem to go by so quickly. Now in our final week of term we have rewards events to look forward to, following another busy term in the Academy. If you keep up to date with our social media platforms, you will already be aware of the many brilliant things our students have experienced. I wrote to you recently with an update on site developments and staffing and the site work will continue over the summer in readiness for September. Many of you also completed the parent survey recently – thank you so much for doing this. I use this feedback to help shape improvements moving forward. I will highlight some key items from your feedback in September.

There is nothing significantly new in this letter, just some reminders for September.

Dates of return:

As previously advertised, the dates of return in September for students are as follows:

Year 7 students only – **Tuesday 5**th **September** (note that students finish at 3pm on this day only, to allow parents to come into the Academy to meet staff and collect students if they wish).

All students - Wednesday 6th September

Times of the day:

Lessons will start promptly at 8:40am. Students from all year groups are able to access the Academy site from the main student entrance on Milehouse Lane, or the rear entrance on Sparch Hollow. These gates are open from 8:15am and students will be allowed access to the Academy building from 8:30am. Please ensure that your child has a coat and umbrella with them in wet and cold weather if they are waiting outside earlier than 8:30am. Lessons finish at 3.20pm (2.30pm on a Wednesday). A breakfast club facility is available 8.00 - 8.30am. This supervised provision is only for students that would like to buy some food or drink. Students can access the Café via the <u>Sparch Hollow gate only</u> from 8am and access the Café through the outside doors.

A supervised homework club is running after school. Students have access to both computers and study space. Please note that this facility is only for students who are completing work and not for gaming/browsing the internet.

Both the breakfast and homework clubs will be in operation from Wednesday 6th September onwards. Arrangements for new Year 7 for their first day on Tuesday 5th September have already been shared.

Uniform, appearance and equipment:

You will have received correspondence previously outlining our uniform, appearance and equipment expectations. At the end of this letter are the clear guidelines about the standards and items of uniform required. Can I make it crystal clear that I have extremely high standards and expectations of all those associated with the Academy. As a member of the school community, you are expected to support the students to maintain these. Please do not waste your money on items that do not meet the requirements as students will not be permitted to wear them. Items such as black trainers, pumps, footwear with logos and Converse are not permitted. I am fully aware that retailers deliberately target parents to sell them trainers that have been marketed as shoes, quite simply it must be a black school shoe. If you are unsure about whether any item of clothing such as trousers or shoes are suitable, could I please encourage you to contact us, and we will be happy to help before you make the purchase. We are also happy for you to contact us at any time regarding piercings and hair colours/ styles for a decision prior to having anything done that might go against the high standards we expect from our learners.
