 offers well resourced, innovative learning opportunities. creates opportunities to write imaginative, clear and effective responses for a wide range of audiences and purposes whilst employing engaging vocabulary, sentence structures and a variety of accurately employed punctuation. encourages and promotes imaginative and original analysis of writers' methods. unites learning with leisure pastimes such as reading for pleasure, formal and informal presentations on an area of personal interest and drama. offers multiple enrichment opportunities that are strategically embedded within the curriculum to develop cultural capital.
