The nature of the family

The term 'nature of the family' means what a family is like (who is in it). Family life has changed over the years and there has been a rise in extended families in the U.K. This is because today many young people cannot afford to buy a house so live with parents for longer. Family has also changed because now same sex couples can get married and have children. Society is also less religious so no longer worry about things such as living together before they are married, or getting divorced.

The family is seen as important because it is believed to be the best place to raise children as it provides stability and protection. It is where you should learn good behaviour and good morals. It should also teach you practical skills ready for when you are an adult.

Christian View - Christians want their children to grow up with values from the Bible, for example compassion, loyalty, loving God. They may believe that God wants them to have children once they are married and that it is their responsibility to raise them well. There are many examples of polygamy in the Bible and in the past some Mormons used this as an argument to justify this practice in their religion. However, it is now only 1 small group in USA who still does this. Polygamy is not accepted by most Christians with the Pope saying it is an 'offence against marriage.'

Raising children in faith families

Christian parents believe that following Christian values and traditions will help the children to have happy and fulfilled lives. They want to share their **traditions** with their children and as parents have the **right** to raise them as they want. They will also hope their children will go to Heaven and as some believe only those who follow Jesus can go to **heaven** they believe they need to raise them as Christians to stop them from going to hell. They also think it is a **duty** to educate children about their religious faith with some even sending them to a religious school where their values are repeated. Most Christian parents do not indoctrinate their children but share their religion with them when they are young in the hope that they will continue to follow it when they are older. Children also have a duty to respect and obey their parents so it is a two way relationship. However, most Christian parents accept that when they are old enough they will make their own choices.

Richard Dawkins is a famous atheist who disagrees with this view. He said raising a child in a religious family is like child abuse. However, many feel that this belittles how awful child abuse really is, and accept that in all families children have to do things that their parents want to at times.



Roles of men and women in the family

Some traditional Christians believe that men are the head of the household and that they should have the role of making the major decisions in the family. Their responsibility is to provide for the family which was important back when jobs were more physical and needed muscle. This is because God made Adam first to be dominant and Eve second to be his helper. This may then believe that the woman's role is to stay at home and cook, clean and care for the children while the man goes to work. They would see the Virgin Mary as a good role model, and think women are naturally more nurturing and caring.

Most Christians today would not agree with this they believe that men and women are equal and both have responsibility in the family. They believe people are created equally by God and that men are not superior. If family life is about love then it should be an equal partnership where duties are shared not where one dominates the other. They would argue the Bible is misquoted and misunderstood. Also, society has changed so most households now need two wages to pay the bills.

Gender equality

Gender equality means that men and women should be given the same rights and opportunities as each other. Most people would agree with this and there have been several laws passed in the U.K. to ensure that gender discrimination does not happen. Despite the passing of laws people are still discriminated against. This can mean women are given fewer opportunities than men like not getting promotion at work. Some Christians would fight against gender equality because they believe God made all people equal in the image of God. Also there are numerous accounts of Jesus treating women with respect and welcoming them as followers (story Mary and Martha). Lso Jesus appeared to Mary first after his resurrection and told her to spread the word, showing women should be given important jobs.

Other Christians do not believe that men and women are equal. They believe that women should stay at home and look after the home and children. They argue that women are made to produce children and so cannot do some of the things men do. This view may come from the way that they interpret the Bible literally.

Roles of men and women in the Church

There is still an on-going debate about the role of women in the Church.

ARGUMENTS AGAINST THE ORDINATION OF WOMEN

CATHOLICS do not allow women priests because they believe that the hierarchy of the Church reflects Jesus and his disciples who were all male. In the Old Testament women were seen as the property of men. Some passages in the Bible suggest that women should not take lead roles in the Church and it goes against tradition. It also says that man should be the head of the household and that women's roles should be limited. They would argue Adam was made first whereas Eve was made from his ribs and was a helper and some say a temptress.

ARGUMENTS FOR THE ORDINATION OF WOMEN

Other Christians believe that women should have equal roles in the Church including being an ordained minister. They believe this because Jesus was revolutionary in his treatment of women at that time. Men and women were created equally in the image of God therefore should be treated equally by the Church. The first people Jesus appeared to were women which shows the importance of women and their value in spreading the Good News of the faith. St. Paul taught that men and women were equal to each other in the eyes of Christ. The C of E Church and Methodists do ordain women as ministers.
