
Present Tense – Regular RE Verbs



Used when talking about something which is happening now or which happens in general.

An RE verb is just a verb (infinitive) which ends in RF.

EXAMPLES OF REGULAR RE VERBS

attendre – to wait (for)

descendre - to descend

vendre – to sell

entendre – to hear

perdre – to lose

HOW DO I FORM IT?

1. Choose your verb (infinitive)

e.g. **vendre** – to sell

2. Take off the RE and add the following endings depending on which person is doing the action:

e.g. Nous vendons - We sell
