DRSMTI

Dynamics - How loud or soft a piece of music is.

Rhythm - A pattern of notes and rests that give music a sense of movement.

Structure - The order of a piece of music, such as the order of sections.

Melody - The sequence of notes that form a tune.

Texture - The way in which different parts of a piece of music are combined.

Intensity - The amount of energy or volume in a piece of music.

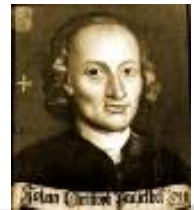
