J'aime = I like  
 J'adore = I love  
 Je n'aime pas = I don't like  
 Je déteste = I hate  
 Je préfère = I prefer

**Intensifiers**

Use before an adjective for more impact!

très = very  
 vraiment = really  
 assez = quite  
 un peu = a little/a bit  
 trop = too

**Negative expressions**

ne...pas = not  
 ne...jamais = never  
 ne...rien = nothing  
 \*ne shortens to n' in front of a vowel

**Possessive adjectives**

mon/**ma**/**mes** = my  
 ton/**ta**/**tes** = your  
 son/**sa**/**ses** = his/hers

**Adjectival agreement** The adjective has to agree with (match) the gender of the noun it is describing.

	Masculine singular	Feminine singular
<b>most adjectives</b>	arrogant intelligent	arrogante intelligente
<b>ending in -e</b>	drôle modeste	drôle modeste
<b>ending in -eux</b>	ennuyeux sérieux	ennuyeuse sérieuse
<b>irregular</b>	beau	belle

**The near future tense**

Use this tense to talk about what you are going to do

1. Correct part of **aller**
2. An **infinitive verb**

Je vais **voir** un film au cinéma ce soir avec mes amis et nous allons **manger** du popcorn. Ça va être génial.

**The perfect (past) tense**

Use this tense to talk about what you did or have done

1. **j'ai** or **je suis**
2. **Past participle**

Hier, j'ai **bavardé** avec mon meilleur ami sur mon portable. Après, j'ai **lu** un roman. C'était relaxant.

**Key irregular verbs in the past tense**

J'ai **bu** = I drank  
 J'ai **fait** = I did  
 J'ai **vu** = I saw  
 J'ai **lu** = I read  
 J'ai **pris** = I took  
 Je suis **allé(e)** = I went
