


- *il faut* = you must / it is necessary to
- *il ne faut pas* = you must not
+ infinitive



- *Est-ce que tu...?* = do you...?
- *Qu'est-ce que tu...?* = what do you...?

tu = you for one person whom you know well

vous = you for more than one person or one person in a formal setting

There are four ways to say « to the » in French.

m.singular = le → **au**
f.singular = la → **à la**
vowel or h = l' → **à l'**
plural = les → **aux**

c'est bon pour la santé it's good for your health
pour l'apparence physique for physical appearance
pour le plaisir for pleasure
pour se défoncer for stress relief
pour se relaxer to relax
c'est amusant it's fun

jouer à and faire de

- Use *jouer à* with sports that you play
- Use *faire de* with sports that you do
- *à* and *de* change when used with the definite articles *le* and *les*

	Masculine singular	Feminine singular	Before a vowel	Plural
<i>J'aime jouer...</i>	au basket	à la pétanque		aux boules
<i>J'aime faire...</i>	du vélo	de la voile	de l'athlétisme	des arts martiaux

- When *faire* is used with a sport, it sometimes translates as "to go" e.g. *On peut faire du vélo* = We can go cycling

The comparative

Use the comparative to compare two or more things

- *plus* + adjective + *que* = more ... than ...
- *moins* + adjective + *que* = less... than ...

Le ski est plus amusant que le cyclisme
Skiing is **more fun than cycling**

• The adjective must agree with (match) the first noun
La voile est plus fatigante que le tennis
Sailing is **more tiring than tennis**

- With plural nouns use *sont* (are) and not *est* (is)

Key Verbs

- jouer** = to play
faire = to do
pouvoir = to be able to/can
courir = to run
s'entraîner = to train
gagner = to win
marquer = to score
trouver = to find
nager = to swim
regarder = to watch
visiter = to visit
chercher = to look for
tourner = to turn
prendre = to take
aller = to go



The Imperative

Use to give instructions

You need the **tu** and **vous** forms of the verb

- **vous prenez** = you take → *prenez* (take!)
- **vous allez** = you go → *allez* (go!)
- **tu prends** = you take → *prends* (take!)

For -er verbs (and **aller**) you take off the final -s

- **tu tournes** = you turn → *tourne* (turn!)
- **tu vas** = you go → *va* (go!)
