OSCAR Our School Cares About Reading



In addition to the ACE rewards system on Talaxy, we now have an extra addition with OSCAR points. Any student demonstrating a passion for reading will be awarded an OSCAR point for their efforts.

At the end of each half term, the OSCAR trophy will be awarded to the student who has made an outstanding contribution to reading at The Orme Academy; nominated by class teachers.

## **INTRODUCTION OF SPARX READER**

Exciting news! This term, the English Department have launched SPARX reader in all library lessons.

SPARX reader is a reading, comprehension and vocabulary digital program that gets all young people reading regularly to help to improve their literacy.

Once a student has completed on-boarding, they can access a range of books matched to their reading ability. Students will gain Sparx Reading Points and teachers are able to monitor accuracy and precision with an on-line monitoring tool.



Students who complete all homework set on SPARX reader will be awarded with a GOLD Card which will trigger prizes and other incentives.



#### Primary Transition READING

During Enrichment, several primary schools in the local area have taken part in a performance workshop led by The Orme Academy. This term, year 6 students have been focusing on script writing and creating their own lyrics.

Students have concentrated on the development of vocabulary and intonation of speech. From page to performance, students have selected word choices and included these in their work.

For the fourth year running, Songbook 2023 will see young people join together to deliver a Christmas message to the local community. This year, the chosen hit was 'I'm Still Standing' the original Elton John classic more recently made famous by the animated movie 'SING.'

Students have explored vocabulary and added their own interpretations to appeal to different target audiences.
