Welcome to our Attendance Newsletter. The aim of this letter is to promote improved attendance for the students at Ridgeway.

As part of our commitment to providing children with the best possible education, experiences and outcomes we regularly monitor children's attendance. Setting good attendance patterns from an early age helps your child later on in life, and for every day that your child is absent or late it makes it more difficult for them to progress and achieve their full potential.

We monitor students with attendance of 96% or under (equivalent to 10 missed school days over an academic year). 73% of students who have attendance over 95% or over achieve 5 or more GCSE's at grades A*-C, so it's vital that students are in school to learn.

National Secondary Attendance

National average secondary school attendance is currently **92.1%**, and we are consistently above this. We continue to strive to have students in our building and learning every day.

Is my child well enough to come to school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. If your child becomes unwell at school we will contact you.

COVID-19

Your child is no longer required to do a COVID – 19 rapid lateral flow test if they have symptoms. But if your child does test positive they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.

Update to Penalty Notices

There are significant changes that parents need to be aware of:

- If your child has 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 school week rolling period, you may be issued with a Penalty Notice. These 10 sessions may include any unauthorised absence, including leave in term time and do not have to be consecutive.
- Penalty Notices are increasing to £160 from September 2024. This can be reduced to £80 but only for the first Penalty Notice issued, if paid within 21 days this reduction does not apply to any subsequent Penalty Notice.
- Any 2nd Penalty Notice, to the same parent for the same child, issued within three years of the date of the first Penalty Notice will be charged at a flat rate of £160
- A third Penalty Notice will not be issued within a three year rolling period, to the same parent for the unauthorised absence of the same child, – alternative action or legal measures will be utilised for subsequent offences.
- In some circumstances a 'Notice to Improve' may be issued However, a Notice to Improve will only be used in cases where support is appropriate. They will not be issued in cases of unauthorised leave in term time for holidays, where information for parents is included on schools website or a simple warning by the school that a Penalty Notice could be issued if unauthorised leave in term time is taken will suffice.
