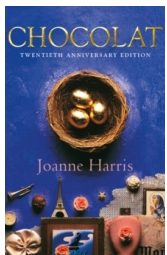


## Fiction

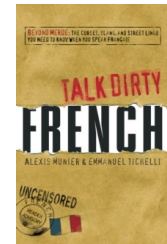
## Notre-Dame: The Soul of France by Agnes Poirier

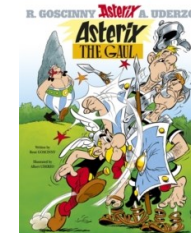
## Talk Dirty French by Munier & Tichelli
